### Definitions of "Intensify" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “intensify” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Make the chemically affected part of (a negative) denser or more opaque in order produce a stronger contrast between light and dark.*
- *Become or make more intense.*
- *Make more intense, stronger, or more marked.*
- *Increase in extent or intensity.*
- *Make more intense, stronger, or more marked.*
- *Become more intense.*
- *Increase the opacity of (a negative) using a chemical.*

### Synonyms of "Intensify" as a verb (14 Words)

<b>add to</b>	Make an addition (to); join or combine or unite with others; increase the quality, quantity, size or scope of.
<b>augment</b>	Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase. <i>The recent speech of the president <b>augmented</b> tensions in the Near East.</i>

<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>He d had his wallet <b>boosted</b> in a bar.</i>
<b><u>compound</u></b>	Combine so as to form a whole; mix. <i>A dialect <b>compounded</b> of Spanish and Dutch.</i>
<b>concentrate</b>	Compress or concentrate. <i>Luke wants to <b>concentrate</b> on his film career.</i>
<b><u>deepen</u></b>	Become deeper in tone. <i>This event only <b>deepened</b> my convictions.</i>
<b><u>escalate</u></b>	Increase in extent or intensity. <i>We do not want to <b>escalate</b> the war.</i>
<b>heighten</b>	Increase the height of. <i><b>Heighten</b> the tension.</i>
<b>increase</b>	Become bigger or greater in amount. <i>The boss finally <b>increased</b> her salary.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise in rank or condition. <i><b>Raise</b> a siege.</i>
<b><u>reinforce</u></b>	Strengthen and support with rewards. <i>Paratroopers were sent to <b>reinforce</b> the troops already in the area.</i>
<b><u>sharpen</u></b>	Make (one's senses) more acute. <i>The debate <b>sharpened</b>.</i>
<b>step up</b>	Put down or press the foot, place the foot.
<b>strengthen</b>	Give a healthy elasticity to. <i>His body <b>strengthened</b>.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Intensify" as a verb

- *The dispute began to intensify.*
- *The negative may be intensified with bichloride.*
- *They had intensified their military campaign.*

<b>augment</b>	Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase. <i>The pressure <b>augmented</b>.</i>
<b>bolster</b>	Prop up with a pillow or bolster. <i>They <b>bolstered</b> the seats for a more comfortable ride.</i>

<b>bond</b>	Join or be joined by a chemical bond. <i>English <b>bond</b>.</i>
<b><u>brace</u></b>	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>Police are <b>braced</b> for a traffic nightmare today.</i>
<b>cooperation</b>	Assistance, especially by complying readily with requests. <i>They agreed on a policy of <b>cooperation</b>.</i>
<b><u>deepen</u></b>	Make or become deep or deeper. <i>Her voice <b>deepened</b> when she whispered the password.</i>
<b>defensible</b>	Capable of being defended. <i>A fort with a <b>defensible</b> yard at its feet.</i>
<b>development</b>	A recent event that has some relevance for the present situation. <i>The <b>development</b> of his ideas took many years.</i>
<b>enhance</b>	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This sauce will <b>enhance</b> the flavor of the meat.</i>
<b><u>escalate</u></b>	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>The Allies <b>escalated</b> the bombing.</i>
<b>exacerbate</b>	Make worse. <i>The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only <b>exacerbated</b> the problem.</i>
<b><u>fortify</u></b>	Add nutrients to. <i>Most commercial brands of almond milk are fortified with vitamins A, D, B2, B12, calcium, and zinc.</i>
<b><u>harden</u></b>	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. <i>The cold <b>hardened</b> the butter.</i>
<b>heighten</b>	Make or become more intense. <i>The athletes kept jumping over the steadily <b>heightened</b> bars.</i>
<b>increase</b>	The amount by which something increases. <i>The <b>increase</b> is scheduled for next month.</i>
<b>intensification</b>	The action of making or becoming more intense. <i>The <b>intensification</b> of the conflict.</i>
<b>intension</b>	What you must know in order to determine the reference of an expression.
<b><u>intensity</u></b>	High level or degree; the property of being intense. <i>Hydrothermal processes of low <b>intensity</b>.</i>
<b>meliorate</b>	To make better.
<b><u>optimize</u></b>	Rearrange or rewrite (data, software, etc.) to improve efficiency of retrieval or processing. <i><b>Optimize</b> your resources.</i>

<b>ossify</b>	Become rigid or fixed in attitude or position; cease developing. <i>These tracheal cartilages may <b>ossify</b>.</i>
<b><u>reinforce</u></b>	Strengthen and support with rewards. <i>He <b>reinforced</b> the concrete.</i>
<b><u>reinforcement</u></b>	Information that makes more forcible or convincing. <i>His gestures provided eloquent <b>reinforcement</b> for his complaints.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise to one s feet. <i>He didn t <b>rise</b> to my teasing.</i>
<b><u>sharpen</u></b>	Raise the pitch of (musical notes). <i>We had to <b>sharpen</b> our arguments.</i>
<b>strength</b>	A number of people required to make such a group complete. <i>It s double the <b>strength</b> of your average beer.</i>
<b>strengthen</b>	Make strong or stronger. <i>This exercise will <b>strengthen</b> your upper body.</i>
<b><u>stronghold</u></b>	A place where a particular cause or belief is strongly defended or upheld. <i>A Labour <b>stronghold</b>.</i>
<b>toughen</b>	Make tough or tougher. <i>He tried to <b>toughen</b> his son up by sending him to public school.</i>
<b><u>widening</u></b>	An increase in width.
