Definitions of "Intensify" as a verb

- Make the chemically affected part of (a negative) denser or more opaque in order produce a stronger contrast between light and dark.
- Become or make more intense.
- Make more intense, stronger, or more marked.
- Increase in extent or intensity.
- Make more intense, stronger, or more marked.
- Become more intense.
- Increase the opacity of (a negative) using a chemical.

- add to Make an addition (to); join or combine or unite with others; increase the quality, quantity, size or scope of.
- augment Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase.
- The recent speech of the president **augment**ed tensions in the Near East.



boost	Give a boost to be beneficial to. He d had his wallet boost ed in a bar.
<u>compound</u>	Combine so as to form a whole; mix. A dialect compound ed of Spanish and Dutch.
concentrate	Compress or concentrate. Luke wants to concentrate on his film career.
<u>deepen</u>	Become deeper in tone. This event only deepen ed my convictions.
<u>escalate</u>	Increase in extent or intensity. We do not want to escalate the war.
heighten	Increase the height of. <i>Heighten</i> the tension.
increase	Become bigger or greater in amount. The boss finally increase d her salary.
raise	Raise in rank or condition. <i>Raise</i> a siege.
reinforce	Strengthen and support with rewards. Paratroopers were sent to reinforce the troops already in the area.
<u>sharpen</u>	Make (one's senses) more acute. <i>The debate sharpened.</i>
step up	Put down or press the foot, place the foot.
strengthen	Give a healthy elasticity to. <i>His body strengthened.</i>

Usage Examples of "Intensify" as a verb

- The dispute began to intensify.
- The negative may be intensified with bichloride.
- They had intensified their military campaign.

Associations of "Intensify" (30 Words)

augment	Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase. <i>The pressure</i> augment ed.
bolster	Prop up with a pillow or bolster. They bolster ed the seats for a more comfortable ride.



bond	Join or be joined by a chemical bond. <i>English bond.</i>
<u>brace</u>	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. Police are brace d for a traffic nightmare today.
cooperation	Assistance, especially by complying readily with requests. <i>They agreed on a policy of cooperation</i> .
<u>deepen</u>	Make or become deep or deeper. Her voice deepen ed when she whispered the password.
defensible	Capable of being defended. A fort with a defensible yard at its feet.
development	A recent event that has some relevance for the present situation. The development of his ideas took many years.
enhance	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This sauce will enhance the flavor of the meat.</i>
<u>escalate</u>	Make or become more intense or serious. <i>The Allies escalated the bombing.</i>
exacerbate	Make worse. The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only exacerbate d the problem.
<u>fortify</u>	Add nutrients to. Most commercial brands of almond milk are fortified with vitamins A, D, B2, B12, calcium, and zinc.
<u>harden</u>	Harden by reheating and cooling in oil. <i>The cold hardened the butter.</i>
heighten	Make or become more intense. The athletes kept jumping over the steadily heighten ed bars.
increase	The amount by which something increases. The increase is scheduled for next month.
intensification	The action of making or becoming more intense. The intensification of the conflict.
intension	What you must know in order to determine the reference of an expression.
<u>intensity</u>	High level or degree; the property of being intense. <i>Hydrothermal processes of low intensity.</i>
meliorate	To make better.
<u>optimize</u>	Rearrange or rewrite (data, software, etc.) to improve efficiency of retrieval or processing. <i>Optimize</i> your resources.



ossify	Become rigid or fixed in attitude or position; cease developing. These tracheal cartilages may ossify .
<u>reinforce</u>	Strengthen and support with rewards. <i>He reinforced the concrete.</i>
<u>reinforcement</u>	Information that makes more forcible or convincing. <i>His gestures provided eloquent</i> reinforcement <i>for his complaints.</i>
rise	Rise to one s feet. <i>He didn t rise to my teasing.</i>
<u>sharpen</u>	Raise the pitch of (musical notes. We had to sharpen our arguments.
strength	A number of people required to make such a group complete. It s double the strength of your average beer.
strengthen	Make strong or stronger. This exercise will strengthen your upper body.
<u>stronghold</u>	A place where a particular cause or belief is strongly defended or upheld. <i>A Labour</i> stronghold .
toughen	Make tough or tougher. <i>He tried to toughen his son up by sending him to public school.</i>
<u>widening</u>	An increase in width.
