- With earnest and eager attention.






Synonyms of "Intently" as an adverb (11 Words)

| attentively | While paying close attention. Though many of these places see few visitors they are all attentively staffed by local people who are eager to help. |

| carefully | In a way that deliberately avoids harm or errors; cautiously. <i>He listened carefully to the way people spoke.</i> |
| <u>closely</u> | In a collective or unified way. Pens of closely confined fish. |
| <u>earnestly</u> | With sincere and intense conviction; seriously. Talking earnestly with his son. |
| hard | Causing great damage or hardship. Industries hit hard by the depression. |
| <u>keenly</u> | In an eager or enthusiastic manner. The car is keenly priced. |



| observantly | Taking careful notice; attentively or perceptively. <i>He watched everything observantly</i> . |

| steadfastly | In a resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering manner. <i>They remained steadfastly loyal.</i> |
| steadily | At a steady rate or pace. The business has been growing steadily . |
| studiously | With concentration and conscientiousness in one's work or reading. <i>He gets on with his work quietly and studiously.</i> |
| watchfully | In a watchful manner. |

| eloquently | With eloquence. Commentators have spoken eloquently on both sides of the issue. |

| enunciate | Express or state clearly. She enunciate d each word slowly. |
| fixate | Direct one's eyes towards. Erotomaniacs are convinced that the person they have fixate d on loves them in return. |
| focused | Directing a great deal of attention, interest, or activity towards a particular aim. <i>The need for more focused research.</i> |
| gape | A disease of birds with gaping of the mouth as a symptom caused by infestation with gapeworm. <i>Juvenile birds with yellow gapes.</i> |
| <u>gaze</u> | A long fixed look. He fixed his paternal gaze on me. |
| <u>glare</u> | Shine intensely. The pomp and glare of rhetoric. |
| infertile | Incapable of reproducing. Infertile couples are offered specialist advice. |
| <u>irrevocably</u> | In an irrevocable manner. My life changed irrevocably in an instant. |
| knavery | Lack of honesty; acts of lying or cheating or stealing. |
| leer | A lascivious or unpleasant look. <i>He gave me a sly leer.</i> |
| look | Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>His look was fixed on her eyes.</i> |
| observant | Adhering strictly to the rules of a particular religion, especially Judaism. Her observant eye took in every detail. |
| <u>peek</u> | Throw a glance at; take a brief look at. His socks were so full of holes his toes peek ed through. |
| реер | Appear as though from hiding. The sun began to peep out. |
| pronounce | Speak pronounce or utter in a certain way. She was pronounce d dead at the scene. |
| <u>recite</u> | Recite in elocution. <i>Recite</i> a poem. |

| <u>stare</u> | Fixate one's eyes. She tried hard not to stare . |

| <u>staring</u> | Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Staring</i> eyes. |
| <u>stark</u> | Stiff, rigid, or incapable of movement. A stark landscape. |
| thoroughgoing | Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Thoroughgoing</i> research. |
| <u>unadulterated</u> | Not mixed or diluted with any different or extra elements; complete and absolute. The unadulterated truth. |
| <u>unmitigated</u> | Not diminished or moderated in intensity or severity; sometimes used as an intensifier. <i>The tour had been an unmitigated disaster.</i> |
| unmixed | Not mixed with extraneous elements. Bold unmixed colours. |
| <u>utter</u> | Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words. <i>He uttered a curse.</i> |
| watchful | Watching someone or something closely; alert and vigilant. They attended dances under the watchful eye of their father. |
