According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “intently” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

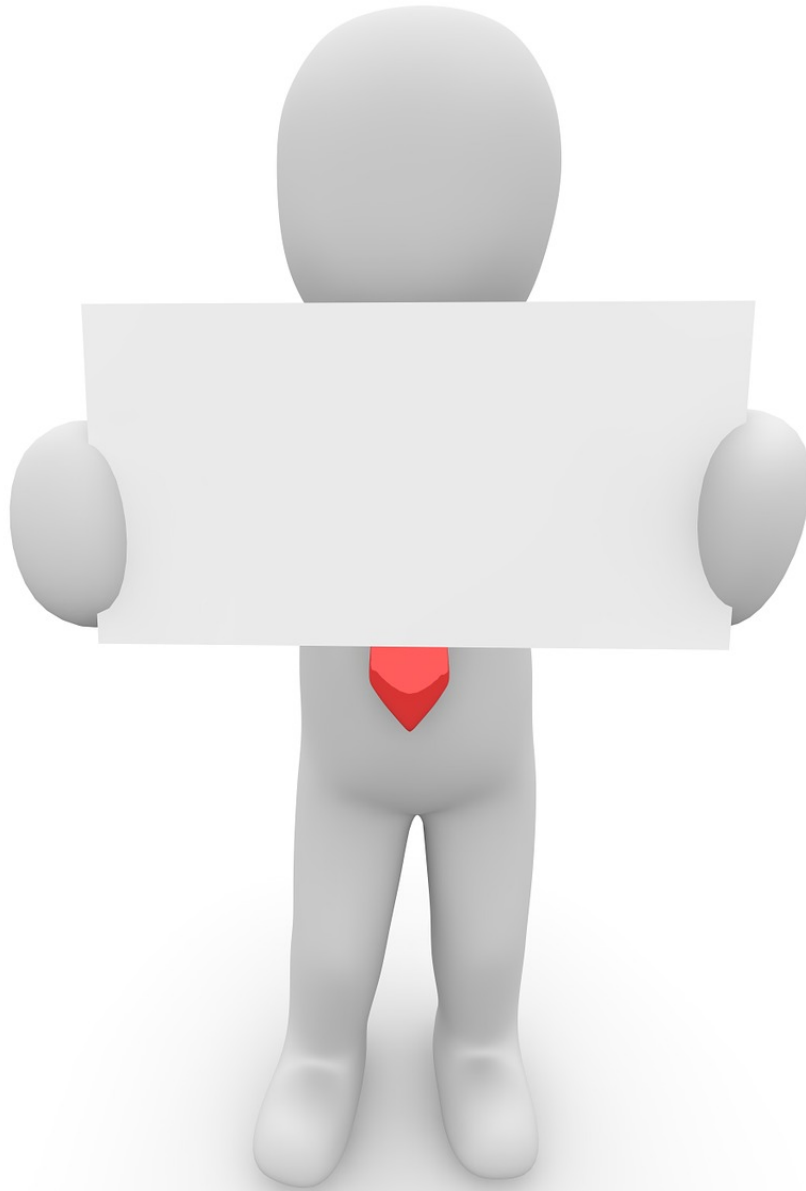
- *With strained or eager attention.*
- *With earnest and eager attention.*



Synonyms of "Intently" as an adverb (11 Words)

- attentively** While paying close attention.
*Though many of these places see few visitors they are all **attentively** staffed by local people who are eager to help.*
- carefully** In a way that deliberately avoids harm or errors; cautiously.
*He listened **carefully** to the way people spoke.*
- closely** In a collective or unified way.
*Pens of **closely** confined fish.*
- earnestly** With sincere and intense conviction; seriously.
*Talking **earnestly** with his son.*
- hard** Causing great damage or hardship.
*Industries hit **hard** by the depression.*
- keenly** In an eager or enthusiastic manner.
*The car is **keenly** priced.*

- observantly** Taking careful notice; attentively or perceptively.
*He watched everything **observantly**.*
- steadfastly** In a resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering manner.
*They remained **steadfastly** loyal.*
- steadily** At a steady rate or pace.
*The business has been growing **steadily**.*
- studiously** With concentration and conscientiousness in one's work or reading.
*He gets on with his work quietly and **studiously**.*
- watchfully** In a watchful manner.

- *He gazed at her intently.*
- *Everybody was listening intently.*



Associations of "Intently" (30 Words)

<u>absolute</u>	(of a decree) final. <i>No mortal being can influence the absolute.</i>
arrant	Complete, utter. <i>What arrant nonsense.</i>
articulate	Put into words or an expression. <i>The ankle bone articulates with the leg bones to form the ankle bones.</i>
complete	Complete a pass. <i>A complete musician.</i>

eloquently	With eloquence. <i>Commentators have spoken eloquently on both sides of the issue.</i>
enunciate	Express or state clearly. <i>She enunciated each word slowly.</i>
fixate	Direct one's eyes towards. <i>Erotomaniacs are convinced that the person they have fixated on loves them in return.</i>
focused	Directing a great deal of attention, interest, or activity towards a particular aim. <i>The need for more focused research.</i>
gape	A disease of birds with gaping of the mouth as a symptom caused by infestation with gapeworm. <i>Juvenile birds with yellow gapes.</i>
<u>gaze</u>	A long fixed look. <i>He fixed his paternal gaze on me.</i>
<u>glare</u>	Shine intensely. <i>The pomp and glare of rhetoric.</i>
infertile	Incapable of reproducing. <i>Infertile couples are offered specialist advice.</i>
<u>irrevocably</u>	In an irrevocable manner. <i>My life changed irrevocably in an instant.</i>
knavery	Lack of honesty; acts of lying or cheating or stealing.
leer	A lascivious or unpleasant look. <i>He gave me a sly leer.</i>
look	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>His look was fixed on her eyes.</i>
observant	Adhering strictly to the rules of a particular religion, especially Judaism. <i>Her observant eye took in every detail.</i>
<u>peek</u>	Throw a glance at; take a brief look at. <i>His socks were so full of holes his toes peeked through.</i>
peep	Appear as though from hiding. <i>The sun began to peep out.</i>
pronounce	Speak pronounce or utter in a certain way. <i>She was pronounced dead at the scene.</i>
<u>recite</u>	Recite in elocution. <i>Recite a poem.</i>

<u>stare</u>	Fixate one's eyes. <i>She tried hard not to stare.</i>
<u>staring</u>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Staring eyes.</i>
<u>stark</u>	Stiff, rigid, or incapable of movement. <i>A stark landscape.</i>
<u>thoroughgoing</u>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Thoroughgoing research.</i>
<u>unadulterated</u>	Not mixed or diluted with any different or extra elements; complete and absolute. <i>The unadulterated truth.</i>
<u>unmitigated</u>	Not diminished or moderated in intensity or severity; sometimes used as an intensifier. <i>The tour had been an unmitigated disaster.</i>
<u>unmixed</u>	Not mixed with extraneous elements. <i>Bold unmixed colours.</i>
<u>utter</u>	Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words. <i>He uttered a curse.</i>
<u>watchful</u>	Watching someone or something closely; alert and vigilant. <i>They attended dances under the watchful eye of their father.</i>
