According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “intently” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

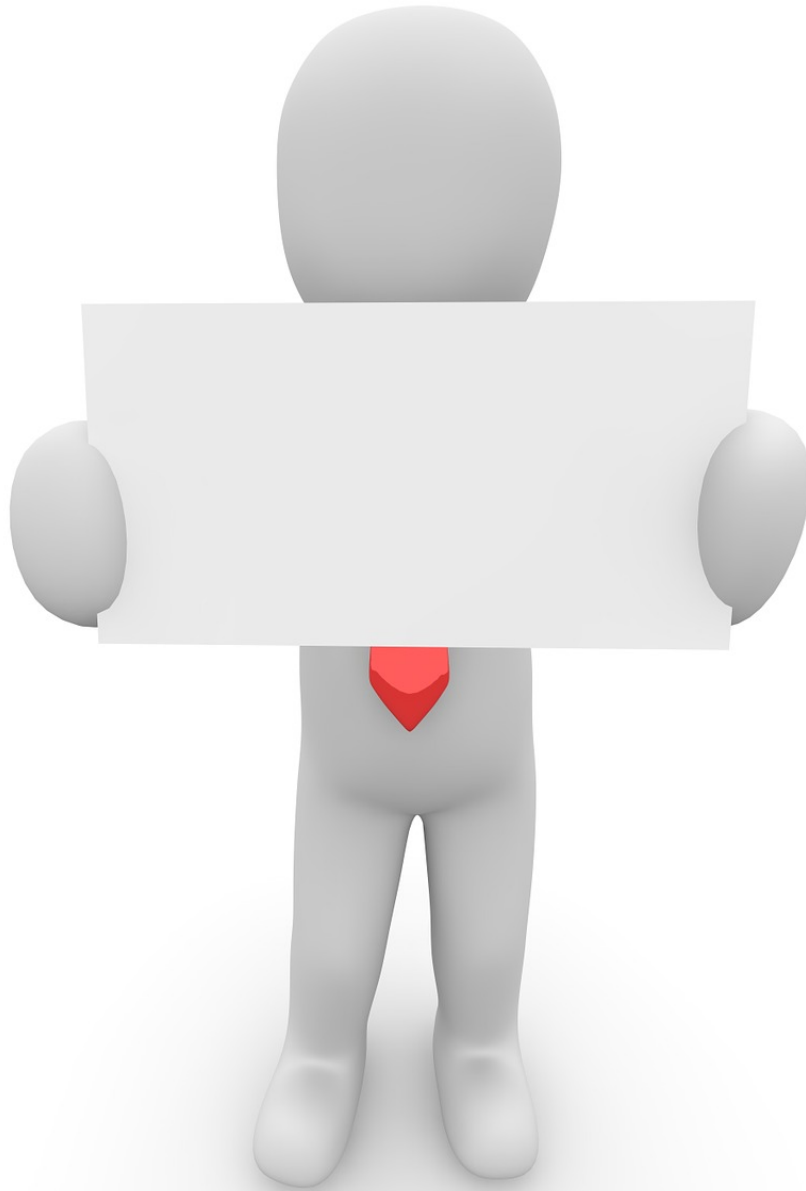
- *With strained or eager attention.*

## Synonyms of "Intently" as an adverb (11 Words)

- attentively** While paying close attention.  
*Though many of these places see few visitors they are all **attentively** staffed by local people who are eager to help.*
- carefully** In a way that deliberately avoids harm or errors; cautiously.  
*He listened **carefully** to the way people spoke.*
- closely** In a collective or unified way.  
*Pens of **closely** confined fish.*
- earnestly** With sincere and intense conviction; seriously.  
*Talking **earnestly** with his son.*
- hard** Causing great damage or hardship.  
*Industries hit **hard** by the depression.*
- keenly** In an eager or enthusiastic manner.  
*The car is **keenly** priced.*

- observantly** Taking careful notice; attentively or perceptively.  
*He watched everything **observantly**.*
- steadfastly** In a resolutely or dutifully firm and unwavering manner.  
*They remained **steadfastly** loyal.*
- steadily** At a steady rate or pace.  
*The business has been growing **steadily**.*
- studiously** With concentration and conscientiousness in one's work or reading.  
*He gets on with his work quietly and **studiously**.*
- watchfully** In a watchful manner.

## Associations of "Intently" (30 Words)

<b><u>absolute</u></b>	(of a decree) final. <i>No mortal being can influence the <b>absolute</b>.</i>
<b>arrant</b>	Complete, utter. <i>What <b>arrant</b> nonsense.</i>
<b>articulate</b>	Put into words or an expression. <i>The ankle bone <b>articulates</b> with the leg bones to form the ankle bones.</i>
<b>complete</b>	Complete a pass. <i>A <b>complete</b> musician.</i>

<b>eloquently</b>	With eloquence. <i>Commentators have spoken <b>eloquently</b> on both sides of the issue.</i>
<b>enunciate</b>	Express or state clearly. <i>She <b>enunciated</b> each word slowly.</i>
<b>fixate</b>	Direct one's eyes towards. <i>Erotomaniacs are convinced that the person they have <b>fixated</b> on loves them in return.</i>
<b>focused</b>	Directing a great deal of attention, interest, or activity towards a particular aim. <i>The need for more <b>focused</b> research.</i>
<b>gape</b>	A disease of birds with gaping of the mouth as a symptom caused by infestation with gapeworm. <i>Juvenile birds with yellow <b>gapes</b>.</i>
<b><u>gaze</u></b>	A long fixed look. <i>He fixed his paternal <b>gaze</b> on me.</i>
<b><u>glare</u></b>	Shine intensely. <i>The pomp and <b>glare</b> of rhetoric.</i>
<b>infertile</b>	Incapable of reproducing. <i><b>Infertile</b> couples are offered specialist advice.</i>
<b><u>irrevocably</u></b>	In an irrevocable manner. <i>My life changed <b>irrevocably</b> in an instant.</i>
<b>knavery</b>	Lack of honesty; acts of lying or cheating or stealing.
<b>leer</b>	A lascivious or unpleasant look. <i>He gave me a sly <b>leer</b>.</i>
<b>look</b>	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>His <b>look</b> was fixed on her eyes.</i>
<b>observant</b>	Adhering strictly to the rules of a particular religion, especially Judaism. <i>Her <b>observant</b> eye took in every detail.</i>
<b><u>peek</u></b>	Throw a glance at; take a brief look at. <i>His socks were so full of holes his toes <b>peeked</b> through.</i>
<b>peep</b>	Appear as though from hiding. <i>The sun began to <b>peep</b> out.</i>
<b>pronounce</b>	Speak pronounce or utter in a certain way. <i>She was <b>pronounced</b> dead at the scene.</i>
<b><u>recite</u></b>	Recite in elocution. <i><b>Recite</b> a poem.</i>

<b><u>stare</u></b>	Fixate one's eyes. <i>She tried hard not to <b>stare</b>.</i>
<b><u>staring</u></b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i><b>Staring</b> eyes.</i>
<b><u>stark</u></b>	Stiff, rigid, or incapable of movement. <i>A <b>stark</b> landscape.</i>
<b><u>thoroughgoing</u></b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i><b>Thoroughgoing</b> research.</i>
<b><u>unadulterated</u></b>	Not mixed or diluted with any different or extra elements; complete and absolute. <i>The <b>unadulterated</b> truth.</i>
<b><u>unmitigated</u></b>	Not diminished or moderated in intensity or severity; sometimes used as an intensifier. <i>The tour had been an <b>unmitigated</b> disaster.</i>
<b><u>unmixed</u></b>	Not mixed with extraneous elements. <i>Bold <b>unmixed</b> colours.</i>
<b><u>utter</u></b>	Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words. <i>He <b>uttered</b> a curse.</i>
<b><u>watchful</u></b>	Watching someone or something closely; alert and vigilant. <i>They attended dances under the <b>watchful</b> eye of their father.</i>
