keenly In an eager or enthusiastic manner.

At a steady rate or pace. **steadily**


The business has been growing **steadily**.

observant Adhering strictly to the rules of a particular religion, especially Judaism.

Her **observant** eye took in every detail.

Throw a glance at; take a brief look at.

His socks were so full of holes his toes **peek**ed through.

peep Appear as though from hiding.

The sun began to **peep** out.

pronounceSpeak pronounce or utter in a certain way.

She was **pronounce**d dead at the scene.

recite Recite in elocution.

Recite a poem.



stare Fixate one's eyes.

She tried hard not to **stare**.

staring Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.

Staring eyes.

stark Stiff, rigid, or incapable of movement.

A **stark** landscape.

thoroughgoing Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.

Thoroughgoing research.

Not mixed or diluted with any different or extra elements; complete and

unadulterated absolute.

The **unadulterated** truth.

Not diminished or moderated in intensity or severity; sometimes used as

unmitigated an intensifier.

The tour had been an **unmitigated** disaster.

unmixed Not mixed with extraneous elements.

Bold unmixed colours.

utter Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words.

He **utter**ed a curse.

watchful Watching someone or something closely; alert and vigilant.

They attended dances under the **watchful** eye of their father.
