<u>acquaint</u>	Make familiar or conversant with. You should acquaint yourself with your new computer.
address	Address or apply oneself to something direct one s efforts towards something such as a question. Address your complaints to the Trading Standards Board.
<u>bulletin</u>	Make public by bulletin.
colloquial	Characteristic of informal spoken language or conversation. Wrote her letters in a colloquial style.
colloquialism	The use of colloquialisms. The colloquialism s of the streets.
communicate	Transmit (heat or motion. <i>The rooms communicated</i> .
communication	A letter or message containing information or news. Satellite communications.
<u>confer</u>	Have a conference in order to talk something over. The Minister may have exceeded the powers confer red on him by Parliament.
<u>convey</u>	Transfer the title to (property. She convey ed the message to me.
<u>cooperatively</u>	In a way that involves mutual assistance in working towards a common goal. A cooperatively owned restaurant.
<u>correspondence</u>	Similarity by virtue of corresponding. His wife dealt with his private correspondence .
delivery	The supply or provision of something. She had a difficult delivery .



email	A message sent by email. Reading email has become the first task of the morning.
ferry	Transport by ferry. Ambulances ferried the injured to hospital.
informing	To furnish incriminating evidence to an officer of the law (usually in return for favors.
message	Send as a message. I was message d by a Californian contact for some information.
persuasively	In a persuasive or convincing manner. He argues persuasively against nationalism.
post	Publicize with or as if with a poster. A pair of post s marked the goal.
recitative	Musical declamation of the kind usual in the narrative and dialogue parts of opera and oratorio, sung in the rhythm of ordinary speech with many words on the same note. <i>Singing in recitative</i> .
<u>relay</u>	Control or operate by relay. The wagons were pulled by relay s of horses.
report	Cover an event or subject as a journalist or a reporter. Police report ed that the floods were abating.
<u>respond</u>	Respond favorably or as hoped. <i>To partner s opening one heart it is dangerous to respond two clubs.</i>
send	Send a message or letter. <i>Send</i> me your latest results.
sender	Someone who transmits a message. <i>Evidence submitted late will be returned to the sender.</i>
spam	Unwanted or intrusive advertising on the internet. An autogenerated spam website.
telegraphic	Of or relating to or transmitted by telegraph. The strange telegraphic speech of some aphasics.
<u>transmit</u>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. Transmit a message.
transport	Something that serves as a means of transportation. The bulk of freight traffic was transport ed by lorry.
verbally	With the function of a verb. She claimed to have been verbally abused.
