Definitions of "Interchangeable" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "interchangeable" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Capable of replacing or changing places with something else.
- (mathematics, logic) such that the arguments or roles can be interchanged.
- (of two things) able to be interchanged.
- Capable of replacing or changing places with something else; permitting mutual substitution without loss of function or suitability.
- Such that the arguments or roles can be interchanged.
- Apparently identical; very similar.

alike	Having the same or similar characteristics. All politicians are alike .
cut from the same cloth	Cut down with a hand implement or machine.
exchangeable	Capable of replacing or changing places with something else.
<u>homogeneous</u>	Consisting of parts all of the same kind. <i>If all jobs and workers were homogeneous.</i>
<u>identical</u>	(of twins) derived from a single egg or ovum. She stole a suitcase from the identical station at which she had been arrested before.
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The twins were indistinguishable</i> .
replaceable	Able to be replaced. A knife with a replaceable blade.
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. Northern India and similar areas.
standardised	Capable of replacing or changing places with something else; permitting mutual substitution without loss of function or suitability.
standardized	Capable of replacing or changing places with something else; permitting mutual substitution without loss of function or suitability. Standardized education.
the same	Closely similar or comparable in kind or quality or quantity or degree.
transposable	Capable of changing sequence.
<u>twin</u>	Of a crystal twinned. <i>Twin seed leaves.</i>
undifferentiated	Not differentiated. By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet undifferentiated between male and female.
<u>uniform</u>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person s uniform. <i>At regular or uniform intervals.</i>

<u>analogous</u>	Corresponding in function but not in evolutionary origin. Salmon roe is marketed as analogous to caviar.
balanced	(especially of food) having different elements in the correct proportions. <i>She assembled a balanced team.</i>
<u>bullet</u>	A projectile that is fired from a gun. Your record s bad but it s doubtful they ll give you the bullet .
caliber	A degree or grade of excellence or worth. <i>An executive of low caliber.</i>
cartridge	An electro-acoustic transducer that is the part of the arm of a record player that holds the needle and that is removable. <i>He loaded a cartridge of fresh tape into the tape deck.</i>



change	Undergo a change become different in essence losing one s or its original nature. <i>He changed his name.</i>
<u>commensurate</u>	Corresponding in size or degree or extent. Pay should be commensurate with the time worked.
<u>comparable</u>	Conforming in every respect. The situation in Holland is comparable to that in England.
compatibility	A state in which two things are able to exist or occur together without problems or conflict. They felt the bond of true compatibility .
compatible	(of two things) able to exist or occur together without problems or conflict. <i>Packages available for IBM PCs and compatibles.</i>
<u>congruent</u>	In agreement or harmony. The rules may not be congruent with the requirements of the law.
congruous	Suitable or appropriate together. This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.
consistently	In a fair and impartial way. Students have to be treated consistently by all staff members.
convert	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. Convert centimeters into inches.
<u>counterpart</u>	A person or thing having the same function or characteristics as another. <i>The minister held talks with his French counterpart</i> .
equal	A person who is of equal standing with another in a group. We all treat each other as equal s.
equivalent	The atomic weight of an element that has the same combining capacity as a given weight of another element; the standard is 8 for oxygen. Send two dollars or the equivalent in stamps.
<u>evenly</u>	In equal numbers, amounts, or values. <i>He was breathing evenly fast asleep.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. She won a blue ribbon for her baking at the county fair .
invariant	Unaffected by a designated operation or transformation. The pattern of cell divisions was found to be invariant .
likeness	A portrait or representation. The only known likeness of Dorothy as a young woman.



<u>parallel</u>	Be side by side with something extending in a line always keeping the same distance run or lie parallel to. A challenge which has no parallel in peacetime this century.
proportionate	Being in due proportion. Proportionate representation of a minority group.
same	Same in identity. People will always notice if you wear the same shirt two days running.
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. Problems similar to mine.
similitude	A person or thing resembling someone or something else. There is a striking similitude between the brother and sister.
symmetrical	Made up of exactly similar parts facing each other or around an axis; showing symmetry. <i>The shape of a hill smooth and symmetrical.</i>
synonymous	Meaning the same or nearly the same. His deeds had made his name synonymous with victory.
<u>throwback</u>	A reversion to an earlier ancestral characteristic. The eyes could be an ancestral throwback .
<u>variant</u>	Differing from a norm or standard. A variant spelling.
