

patchy Irregular or uneven in quality, texture, etc.

Patchy fog.

Lacking any definite plan or order or purpose; governed by or depending

random on chance.

A random choice.

Occurring or distributed over widely spaced and irregular intervals in time

scattered or space.

The forecast is for **scattered** showers.

spasmodicAffected by involuntary jerky muscular contractions; resembling a spasm.

Spasmodic fighting continued.

Occurring at irregular intervals or only in a few places; scattered or

sporadic isolated.

Sporadic fighting broke out.

infrequently Not often; rarely.

A storage area for **infrequently** used items.

occasional Occurring, appearing, or done infrequently and irregularly.

Occasional headaches.

Now and then or here and there.

He was arrogant and **occasionally** callous.

often Many times at short intervals.

He **often** goes for long walks by himself.

patchy Irregular or uneven in quality, texture, etc.

Your coursework was **patchy**.

Relating to the periodic table of the elements.

The **periodic** visits she made to her father.

pimple A small hard inflamed spot on the skin.
