- *Used by people of many nations.*
- *From or between other countries.*
- *Existing, occurring, or carried on between nations.*

external

Happening or arising or located outside or beyond some limits or especially surface.

***External** commerce.*

global

Relating to or encompassing the whole of something, or of a group of things.

*Give students a **global** picture of what is involved in the task.*

intercontinental

Extending or taking place between or among continents.

*An **intercontinental** flight.*

outside

Functioning outside the boundaries or precincts of an organized unit.

*An **outside** chance.*

worldwide

Of worldwide scope or applicability.

***Worldwide** sales of television rights.*

Associations of "International" (30 Words)

airfare	The fare charged for traveling by airplane. <i>Save a bundle in airfare by flying standby.</i>
airline	A commercial enterprise that provides scheduled flights for passengers. <i>Airline pilot.</i>
airport	Relating to or denoting light popular fiction such as is offered for sale to travellers in airports. <i>An airport thriller.</i>
continental	A member of the Continental Army. <i>Continental Europe.</i>
<u>espionage</u>	The practice of spying or of using spies, typically by governments to obtain political and military information. <i>The camouflage and secrecy of espionage.</i>

flight	Shoot a bird in flight. <i>An anti inflationary move aimed at stemming the flight of capital.</i>
global	Having the shape of a sphere or ball- Zane Grey. Global war.
globalization	Growth to a global or worldwide scale. <i>The globalization of the communication industry.</i>
globalize	Make world-wide in scope or application. <i>Markets are being increasingly globalized.</i>
immigration	The place at an airport or country's border where government officials check the documents of people entering that country. <i>A barrier to control illegal immigration from Mexico.</i>
intercontinental	Relating to or travelling between continents. <i>An intercontinental flight.</i>
itinerate	(especially of a Church minister or a magistrate) travel from place to place to perform one's professional duty. <i>Regular use of itinerating magistrates was made.</i>
jaunt	A short excursion or journey made for pleasure. <i>Her regular jaunts to Europe.</i>
migration	The movement of persons from one country or locality to another. <i>The extensive rural to urban migration has created a severe housing shortage.</i>
multinational	A company operating in several countries. <i>1 500 troops were sent to join the multinational force.</i>
nonnative	Not being or composed of aborigines. <i>Our large nonnative population.</i>
odyssey	A long wandering and eventful journey. <i>His odyssey from military man to politician.</i>
overseas	In a place across an ocean. Overseas markets.
platform	A raised level surface on which people or things can stand. <i>A pair of chunky platforms.</i>
shuttle	Transport in a shuttle. <i>The nine o clock shuttle from Edinburgh.</i>
southward	Moving toward the south. <i>Cool air from the ocean to the southward.</i>
stewardess	A woman employed to look after the passengers on a ship or aircraft.

- transnational** Involving or operating in several nations or nationalities.
***Transnational** terrorist networks.*
- travel** Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge.

- trip** Make a trip for pleasure.
*The dog clocked a tremendous 27 47 secs for the 450 metres **trip**.*
- voyage** Go on a voyage.
*His **voyage** to America.*
- westward** In a westerly direction.
*The journey covers eight time zones in a **westward** direction.*
- world** A stage of human life, either mortal or after death.
*It s a wonderful **world**.*
