### **Definitions of "International" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “international” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Agreed on by all or many nations.*
- *Concerning or belonging to all or at least two or more nations.*
- *Used by people of many nations.*
- *From or between other countries.*
- *Existing, occurring, or carried on between nations.*



## Synonyms of "International" as an adjective (5 Words)

### external

Happening or arising or located outside or beyond some limits or especially surface.

***External** commerce.*

### global

Relating to or encompassing the whole of something, or of a group of things.

*Give students a **global** picture of what is involved in the task.*

### intercontinental

Extending or taking place between or among continents.

*An **intercontinental** flight.*

### outside

Functioning outside the boundaries or precincts of an organized unit.

*An **outside** chance.*

### worldwide

Of worldwide scope or applicability.

***Worldwide** sales of television rights.*

## Associations of "International" (30 Words)

<b>airfare</b>	The fare charged for traveling by airplane. <i>Save a bundle in <b>airfare</b> by flying standby.</i>
<b>airline</b>	A commercial enterprise that provides scheduled flights for passengers. <i><b>Airline</b> pilot.</i>
<b>airport</b>	Relating to or denoting light popular fiction such as is offered for sale to travellers in airports. <i>An <b>airport</b> thriller.</i>
<b>continental</b>	A member of the Continental Army. <i><b>Continental</b> Europe.</i>
<b><u>espionage</u></b>	The practice of spying or of using spies, typically by governments to obtain political and military information. <i>The camouflage and secrecy of <b>espionage</b>.</i>

<b>flight</b>	Shoot a bird in flight. <i>An anti inflationary move aimed at stemming the <b>flight</b> of capital.</i>
<b>global</b>	Having the shape of a sphere or ball- Zane Grey. <b>Global</b> war.
<b>globalization</b>	Growth to a global or worldwide scale. <i>The <b>globalization</b> of the communication industry.</i>
<b>globalize</b>	Make world-wide in scope or application. <i>Markets are being increasingly <b>globalized</b>.</i>
<b>immigration</b>	The place at an airport or country's border where government officials check the documents of people entering that country. <i>A barrier to control illegal <b>immigration</b> from Mexico.</i>
<b>intercontinental</b>	Relating to or travelling between continents. <i>An <b>intercontinental</b> flight.</i>
<b>itinerate</b>	(especially of a Church minister or a magistrate) travel from place to place to perform one's professional duty. <i>Regular use of itinerating magistrates was made.</i>
<b>jaunt</b>	A short excursion or journey made for pleasure. <i>Her regular <b>jaunts</b> to Europe.</i>
<b>migration</b>	The movement of persons from one country or locality to another. <i>The extensive rural to urban <b>migration</b> has created a severe housing shortage.</i>
<b>multinational</b>	A company operating in several countries. <i>1 500 troops were sent to join the <b>multinational</b> force.</i>
<b>nonnative</b>	Not being or composed of aborigines. <i>Our large <b>nonnative</b> population.</i>
<b>odyssey</b>	A long wandering and eventful journey. <i>His <b>odyssey</b> from military man to politician.</i>
<b>overseas</b>	In a place across an ocean. <b>Overseas</b> markets.
<b>platform</b>	A raised level surface on which people or things can stand. <i>A pair of chunky <b>platforms</b>.</i>
<b>shuttle</b>	Transport in a shuttle. <i>The nine o clock <b>shuttle</b> from Edinburgh.</i>
<b>southward</b>	Moving toward the south. <i>Cool air from the ocean to the <b>southward</b>.</i>
<b>stewardess</b>	A woman employed to look after the passengers on a ship or aircraft.

- transcontinental** A transcontinental railway or train.  
***Transcontinental** travelers.*
- transnational** Involving or operating in several nations or nationalities.  
***Transnational** terrorist networks.*
- travel** Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge.  
*Perhaps you ll write a book about your **travels**.*
- trip** Make a trip for pleasure.  
*The dog clocked a tremendous 27 47 secs for the 450 metres **trip**.*
- voyage** Go on a voyage.  
*His **voyage** to America.*
- westward** In a westerly direction.  
*The journey covers eight time zones in a **westward** direction.*
- world** A stage of human life, either mortal or after death.  
*It s a wonderful **world**.*
- worldwide** Of worldwide scope or applicability.  
*She travels **worldwide** as a consultant.*
