- *An act of intersecting.*
- *The set of elements common to two or more sets.*
- *The act of intersecting (as joining by causing your path to intersect your target's path.*
- *A representation of common ground between theories or phenomena.*
- *A junction where one street or road crosses another.*
- *A point where lines intersect.*
- *A point at which two or more things intersect, especially a road junction.*



Synonyms of "Intersection" as a noun (14 Words)


carrefour	A junction where one street or road crosses another.
cartesian product	A consequence of someone's efforts or of a particular set of circumstances.
<u>convergence</u>	The occurrence of two or more things coming together. <i>The convergence of lines in the distance.</i>
crossing	The action of crossing something. <i>A border crossing.</i>
crossroad	A junction where one street or road crosses another.
<u>crossroads</u>	A road that crosses a main road or joins two main roads. <i>Freud's work stands at the crossroads between psychology and neurology.</i>
crossway	A junction where one street or road crosses another.

interchange	Mutual interaction; the activity of reciprocating or exchanging (especially information). <i>I listened in shock to this venomous interchange.</i>
intersection point	A representation of common ground between theories or phenomena.
junction	The place where two or more things come together. <i>The vena cava is formed by the junction of three veins.</i>
<u>overlap</u>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>An overlap of shifts.</i>
point of intersection	A wall socket.
product	A substance produced during a natural, chemical, or manufacturing process. <i>That store offers a variety of products.</i>
road junction	A way or means to achieve something.



Usage Examples of "Intersection" as a noun

- *The set of red hats is the intersection of the set of hats and the set of red things.*
- *His course is on a direct intersection with ours.*
- *A red light at the intersection with Brompton Road.*
- *The intersection of a plane and a cone.*

A tree-lined approach to a country house or similar building.
*An **avenue** of limes.*

boulevard

A wide street or thoroughfare.
*Sunset **Boulevard**.*

busy	Of facilities such as telephones or lavatories unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line. <i>Her line is busy.</i>
cable	Send cables wires or telegrams. <i>Steel cables held the convoy together.</i>
convergent	(of a series) approaching a definite limit as more of its terms are added. <i>There are a number of convergent reasons for the growth of interest in pragmatics.</i>
crisscross	Mark with or consist of a pattern of crossed lines. <i>Wrinkles crisscrossed her face.</i>
cross	An animal or plant resulting from cross breeding a hybrid. <i>A Galloway and shorthorn cross.</i>
crossing	The action of crossing something. <i>The cathedral has a lantern tower over the crossing.</i>
crossover	A voter who is registered as a member of one political party but who votes in the primary of another party. <i>A crossover study.</i>
crossroad	A junction where one street or road crosses another.
crosswalk	A marked part of a road where pedestrians have right of way to cross; a pedestrian crossing.
delineation	The action of describing or portraying something precisely. <i>The artist s exquisite delineation of costume and jewellery.</i>
drawbridge	A bridge that can be raised to block passage or to allow boats or ships to pass beneath it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the drawbridge was lowered.</i>
fordable	Shallow enough to be crossed by walking or riding on an animal or in a vehicle. <i>The stream was fordable.</i>
intersect	Meet at a point. <i>Lines of latitude and longitude intersect at right angles.</i>
jaywalk	Cross the road at a red light. <i>You jaywalked across a busy four lane street.</i>
junction	A region of transition in a semiconductor between a part where conduction is mainly by electrons and a part where it is mainly by holes. <i>The junction of Queen s Road and Lancaster Avenue.</i>
lane	A route prescribed for or regularly followed by ships or aircraft. <i>The car moved into the outside lane.</i>

lineation	The action or process of drawing lines or marking with lines. <i>The punctuation and lineation are reproduced accurately.</i>
<u>overlap</u>	A part or amount which overlaps. <i>The curtains overlap at the centre when closed.</i>
<u>partially</u>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>He was partially paralyzed.</i>
pavement	A raised paved or asphalted path for pedestrians at the side of a road. <i>The pavements and columns of these ancient ruins provided the material for more recent structures.</i>
<u>pedestrian</u>	Lacking inspiration or excitement; dull. <i>A pedestrian movie plot.</i>
<u>road</u>	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>The low road of apathy and alienation.</i>
roadway	A road (especially that part of a road) over which vehicles travel.
route	Send via a specific route. <i>The scenic route from Florence to Siena.</i>
sidewalk	A paved path for pedestrians at the side of a road; a pavement.
<u>street</u>	People living or working on the same street. <i>Every week fans stop me in the street.</i>
superimpose	Place or lay (one thing) over another, typically so that both are still evident. <i>Can you superimpose the two images.</i>
walker	A light enclosing framework (trade name Zimmer) with rubber castors or wheels and handles; helps invalids or the handicapped or the aged to walk. <i>He was a keen walker.</i>
