alumnus	A former member of a group, company, or organization. <i>A Royal Ballet alumnus.</i>
bidder	Someone who makes a bid at cards. <i>His government s preferred bidder for the contract.</i>
caller	The person who convenes a meeting. <i>Caller fish.</i>
candidacy	The campaign of a candidate to be elected. <i>He s going to announce his candidacy for the US Senate.</i>
candidate	A politician who is running for public office. <i>An A level candidate.</i>
ceremony	The ritual observances and procedures required or performed at grand and formal occasions. <i>The ceremony of smelling the cork and tasting the wine.</i>
cloture	A rule for limiting or ending debate in a deliberative body. <i>A cloture motion.</i>

countersign	A signal or password given in reply to a soldier on guard. <i>You must countersign on this line of the contract.</i>
democratic	Characterized by or advocating or based upon the principles of democracy or social equality. <i>Democratic art forms.</i>
elected	Subject to popular election.
election	The status or fact of being elected. <i>The 2008 local council elections.</i>
elector	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered electors voted.</i>

endorse	Guarantee as meeting a certain standard. <i>Endorse a new project.</i>
grad	One-hundredth of a right angle.
graduate	A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree. <i>She is 19 a graduate of Lincoln High.</i>
graduated	(of an instrument or container) marked with units of measurement. <i>A graduated tax.</i>
hustings	The campaigning associated with an election. <i>He could hold his own in an election hustings.</i>
name	Give or make a list of name individually give the names of. <i>They named their son David.</i>
nominate	Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. <i>A day was nominated for the exchange of contracts.</i>
nomination	The action of nominating or state of being nominated. <i>There was keen competition for the nomination.</i>
nominee	A person or company, not the owner, in whose name a stock, bond, or company is registered. <i>An offshore nominee company.</i>
presidency	The period of a president's office. <i>Andrew Jackson expanded the power of the presidency beyond what was customary before his time.</i>
presidential	Having a bearing or demeanour befitting a president; dignified and confident. <i>The presidential palace.</i>
pupil	A trainee barrister. <i>They are former pupils of the school.</i>
shortlist	Put someone or something on a shortlist. <i>A shortlist of four companies.</i>
stated	Declared as fact explicitly stated. <i>The stated aim of the programme.</i>
taper	A gradual narrowing. <i>The strong taper of her back.</i>
valedictorian	(in North America) a student who delivers the valedictory at a graduation ceremony.
