| elected | Subject to popular election. |
| election | The status or fact of being elected. The 2008 local council election s. |
| elector | In the US a member of the electoral college. Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered elector s voted. |



| endorse | Guarantee as meeting a certain standard. Endorse a new project. |

| <u>name</u> | Give or make a list of name individually give the names of. They name d their son David. |
| nominate | Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. A day was nominate d for the exchange of contracts. |
| nomination | The action of nominating or state of being nominated. <i>There was keen competition for the nomination.</i> |
| nominee | A person or company, not the owner, in whose name a stock, bond, or company is registered. An offshore nominee company. |
| presidency | The period of a president's office. Andrew Jackson expanded the power of the presidency beyond what was customary before his time. |
| presidential | Having a bearing or demeanour befitting a president; dignified and confident. <i>The presidential palace.</i> |
| pupil | A trainee barrister. They are former pupil s of the school. |
| shortlist | Put someone or something on a shortlist. A shortlist of four companies. |
| stated | Declared as fact explicitly stated. The stated aim of the programme. |
| <u>taper</u> | A gradual narrowing. The strong taper of her back. |
| valedictorian | (in North America) a student who delivers the valedictory at a graduation ceremony. |
