<b>alumnus</b>	A former member of a group, company, or organization. <i>A Royal Ballet <b>alumnus</b>.</i>
<b>bidder</b>	Someone who makes a bid at cards. <i>His government s preferred <b>bidder</b> for the contract.</i>
<b>caller</b>	The person who convenes a meeting. <i><b>Caller</b> fish.</i>
<a href="#">candidacy</a>	The campaign of a candidate to be elected. <i>He s going to announce his <b>candidacy</b> for the US Senate.</i>
<b>candidate</b>	A politician who is running for public office. <i>An A level <b>candidate</b>.</i>
<b>ceremony</b>	The ritual observances and procedures required or performed at grand and formal occasions. <i>The <b>ceremony</b> of smelling the cork and tasting the wine.</i>
<b>cloture</b>	A rule for limiting or ending debate in a deliberative body. <i>A <b>cloture</b> motion.</i>
<b>collegian</b>	A student (or former student) at a college or university.
<b>countersign</b>	A signal or password given in reply to a soldier on guard. <i>You must <b>countersign</b> on this line of the contract.</i>
<b>democratic</b>	Characterized by or advocating or based upon the principles of democracy or social equality. <i><b>Democratic</b> art forms.</i>
<b>elected</b>	Subject to popular election.
<b>election</b>	The status or fact of being elected. <i>The 2008 local council <b>elections</b>.</i>
<b>elector</b>	In the US a member of the electoral college. <i>Close to 60 per cent of the 60 000 registered <b>electors</b> voted.</i>

<b>endorse</b>	Guarantee as meeting a certain standard. <i><b>Endorse</b> a new project.</i>
<b>grad</b>	One-hundredth of a right angle.
<b>graduate</b>	A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree. <i>She is 19 a <b>graduate</b> of Lincoln High.</i>
<b>graduated</b>	(of an instrument or container) marked with units of measurement. <i>A <b>graduated</b> tax.</i>
<b>hustings</b>	The campaigning associated with an election. <i>He could hold his own in an election <b>hustings</b>.</i>
<b>name</b>	Give or make a list of name individually give the names of. <i>They <b>named</b> their son David.</i>
<b>nominate</b>	Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. <i>A day was <b>nominated</b> for the exchange of contracts.</i>
<b>nomination</b>	The action of nominating or state of being nominated. <i>There was keen competition for the <b>nomination</b>.</i>
<b>nominee</b>	A person or company, not the owner, in whose name a stock, bond, or company is registered. <i>An offshore <b>nominee</b> company.</i>
<b>presidency</b>	The period of a president's office. <i>Andrew Jackson expanded the power of the <b>presidency</b> beyond what was customary before his time.</i>
<b>presidential</b>	Having a bearing or demeanour befitting a president; dignified and confident. <i>The <b>presidential</b> palace.</i>
<b>pupil</b>	A trainee barrister. <i>They are former <b>pupils</b> of the school.</i>
<b>shortlist</b>	Put someone or something on a shortlist. <i>A <b>shortlist</b> of four companies.</i>
<b>stated</b>	Declared as fact explicitly stated. <i>The <b>stated</b> aim of the programme.</i>
<b>taper</b>	A gradual narrowing. <i>The strong <b>taper</b> of her back.</i>
<b>valedictorian</b>	(in North America) a student who delivers the valedictory at a graduation ceremony.
