**interlocking** Linked or locked closely together as by dovetailing.  
*A design of **interlocking** leaves.*

| <b>knitting</b>               | The craft or action of knitting.<br><i>I put down my <b>knitting</b>.</i>  |
| <b>linen</b>                  | White goods or clothing made with linen cloth.<br><i>He dealt in Irish <b>linens</b>.</i>  |
