*A design of **interlocking** leaves.*

| amalgam | An alloy of mercury with another metal usually silver used by dentists to fill cavities in teeth except for iron and platinum all metals dissolve in mercury and chemists refer to the resulting mercury mixtures as amalgams. <i>His theory is an amalgam of earlier ideas.</i> |
| barb | The pointed part of barbed wire. <i>Barbed wire.</i> |
| cotton | Cotton wool. A cotton reel. |
| crochet | Make a garment or piece of fabric using crochet. A crochet hook. |
| embroidery | Embellishment or exaggeration in the description of an event. <i>The bazaars stock a wide variety of embroidery.</i> |
| fabric | The basic structure of a society, culture, activity, etc. <i>The multicultural fabric of Canadian society.</i> |
| filling | The act of filling something. <i>When he yawned I could see the gold fillings in his teeth.</i> |
| join | Cause to become joined or linked. <i>The two roads join here.</i> |
| knit | A basic knitting stitch. <i>Knit one purl one.</i> |
| knitting | The craft or action of knitting. <i>I put down my knitting.</i> |
| linen | White goods or clothing made with linen cloth. <i>He dealt in Irish linens.</i> |
| lining | The act of attaching an inside lining to a garment or curtain etc. <i>Self clean oven linings.</i> |
| mix | An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>Arriving at the correct mix of full time to part time staff.</i> |
| needle | Prick with a needle. <i>She wound the gramophone and lowered the needle on to the record.</i> |
| needlepoint | Embroider in needlepoint. |
| net | Catch or land a fish or other animal with a net. <i>He spread his net far and wide in his long search for success.</i> |
| nylon | Stockings or tights made of nylon. <i>Nylon carpet.</i> |

| patchwork | Sewing consisting of pieces of different materials sewn together in a pattern. A patchwork bedspread. |
| sampler | A representative collection or example of something. A sampler of rock plants. |
| sew | Attach something to something else by sewing. Can the seamstress sew me a suit by next week. |
| silk | Animal fibers produced by silkworms and other larvae that spin cocoons and by most spiders. Helmets covered with bright silks . |
| spangle | Decorate with spangles. Stars spangled the moonless sky. |
| stitch | Make mend or join something with stitches. He was panting and had a stitch . |
| tapestry | Something that resembles a tapestry in its complex pictorial designs. Tapestry bags. |
| thread | Thread on or as if on a string. Thread a needle. |
| weft | The yarn woven across the warp yarn in weaving. Weft threads. |
| wool | Yarn or textile fibre made from wool. A sampler in coloured wools . |
| yarn | Tell or spin a yarn. He had a bit of a yarn with the others. |
