An alloy of mercury with another metal usually silver used by dentists to fill

cavities in teeth except for iron and platinum all metals dissolve in mercury

and chemists refer to the resulting mercury mixtures as amalgams.

join Cause to become joined or linked.

The two roads **join** here.

knit A basic knitting stitch.

Knit one purl one.

knitting The craft or action of knitting.

I put down my **knitting**.

linen White goods or clothing made with linen cloth.

He dealt in Irish **linen**s.

liningThe act of attaching an inside lining to a garment or curtain etc.

Self clean oven **lining**s.

mix

An event that combines things in a mixture.

Arriving at the correct **mix** of full time to part time staff.

Prick with a needle.

She wound the gramophone and lowered the **needle** on to the record.

needlepoint Embroider in needlepoint.

net Catch or land a fish or other animal with a net.

He spread his **net** far and wide in his long search for success.

Stockings or tights made of nylon.

Nylon carpet.



patchwork Sewing consisting of pieces of different materials sewn together in a pattern.

A patchwork bedspread.

sampler A representative collection or example of something.

A sampler of rock plants.

sew Attach something to something else by sewing. Can the seamstress **sew** me a suit by next week.

Animal fibers produced by silkworms and other larvae that spin cocoons and

silk by most spiders.

Helmets covered with bright silks.

spangle Decorate with spangles.

Stars **spangle**d the moonless sky.

stitch Make mend or join something with stitches.

He was panting and had a **stitch**.

Something that resembles a tapestry in its complex pictorial designs.

Tapestry bags.

thread Thread on or as if on a string.

Thread a needle.

weft The yarn woven across the warp yarn in weaving.

Weft threads.

wool Yarn or textile fibre made from wool.

A sampler in coloured wools.

yarn Tell or spin a yarn.

He had a bit of a **yarn** with the others.
