
Intolerant as an Adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "intolerant" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Unable to be given (a medicine or other treatment) or to eat (a food) without adverse effects.
- Not tolerant of views, beliefs, or behaviour that differ from one's own.
- (of a plant or animal) unable to survive exposure to (a particular physical influence).
- Narrow-minded about cherished opinions.
- *Unwilling to tolerate difference of opinion.*
