*He stared with **brooding** eyes.*

Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences.

self-examining

Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences.

catholic	Of or relating to or supporting Catholicism. <i>Her tastes are pretty catholic.</i>
characteristic	The integer part positive or negative of the representation of a logarithm in the expression $\log 6432808$ the characteristic is 2. <i>Certain defining characteristics of the school emerge from the study.</i>
<u>characterization</u>	A graphic or vivid verbal description. <i>The pamphlet contained brief characterizations of famous Vermonters.</i>
chastity	Morality with respect to sexual relations. <i>Vows of chastity.</i>

confessional	A booth where a priest sits to hear confessions. <i>The autobiography is remarkably confessional.</i>
contemplation	The action of looking thoughtfully at something for a long time. <i>The road is too busy for leisurely contemplation of the scenery.</i>
extrovert	Relating to denoting or typical of an extrovert. <i>His extrovert personality made him the ideal host.</i>
<u>hush</u>	Suppress public mention of something. <i>He placed a finger before pursed lips to hush her.</i>
<u>introspection</u>	The examination or observation of one's own mental and emotional processes. <i>Quiet introspection can be extremely valuable.</i>
introversion	An introverted disposition; concern with one's own thoughts and feelings. <i>The tongue tied introversion of the self conscious artist.</i>
<u>introvert</u>	Fold inwards. <i>He introverted his feelings.</i>
introverted	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences.
lowliness	A position of inferior status; low in station or rank or fortune or estimation.
meditation	A written or spoken discourse expressing considered thoughts on a subject. <i>The habit of meditation is the basis for all real knowledge.</i>
modesty	Behaviour, manner, or appearance intended to avoid impropriety or indecency. <i>Modesty forbade her to undress in front of so many people.</i>
passivity	The trait of remaining inactive; a lack of initiative. <i>The perceived passivity of the populace is deceptive.</i>
personality	A celebrity or famous person. <i>She is a Hollywood personality.</i>
pulpit	A raised enclosed platform in a church or chapel from which the preacher delivers a sermon. <i>Many ministers delivered political guidance from their pulpits.</i>
punctilious	Showing great attention to detail or correct behaviour. <i>Punctilious in his attention to rules of etiquette.</i>
quiet	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>I ll have a quiet word with him.</i>

<u>reserved</u>	Marked by self-restraint and reticence-Victoria Sackville-West. <i>A reserved seat.</i>
<u>self</u>	Relating to of or by or to or from or for the self. <i>Language is an aspect of a person s sense of self.</i>
shy	Short. <i>I was pretty shy at school.</i>
<u>stillness</u>	Calmness without winds. <i>Absolute stillness greeted our gaze.</i>
<u>timid</u>	Lacking self-confidence. <i>Whitewater rafting is not for the timid.</i>
trait	A distinguishing quality or characteristic, typically one belonging to a person. <i>The traditionally British trait of self denigration.</i>
uncommunicative	Unwilling to talk or impart information. <i>The uncommunicative Emily disappeared.</i>
winsome	Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>
