<b>catholic</b>	Of or relating to or supporting Catholicism. <i>Her tastes are pretty <b>catholic</b>.</i>
<b>characteristic</b>	The integer part positive or negative of the representation of a logarithm in the expression $\log 643\ 2\ 808$ the characteristic is 2. <i>Certain defining <b>characteristics</b> of the school emerge from the study.</i>
<b><u>characterization</u></b>	A graphic or vivid verbal description. <i>The pamphlet contained brief <b>characterizations</b> of famous Vermonters.</i>
<b>chastity</b>	Morality with respect to sexual relations. <i>Vows of <b>chastity</b>.</i>

<b>confessional</b>	A booth where a priest sits to hear confessions. <i>The autobiography is remarkably <b>confessional</b>.</i>
<b>contemplation</b>	The action of looking thoughtfully at something for a long time. <i>The road is too busy for leisurely <b>contemplation</b> of the scenery.</i>
<b>extrovert</b>	Relating to denoting or typical of an extrovert. <i>His <b>extrovert</b> personality made him the ideal host.</i>
<b><u>hush</u></b>	Suppress public mention of something. <i>He placed a finger before pursed lips to <b>hush</b> her.</i>
<b><u>introspection</u></b>	The examination or observation of one's own mental and emotional processes. <i>Quiet <b>introspection</b> can be extremely valuable.</i>
<b>introversion</b>	An introverted disposition; concern with one's own thoughts and feelings. <i>The tongue tied <b>introversion</b> of the self conscious artist.</i>
<b><u>introvert</u></b>	Fold inwards. <i>He <b>introverted</b> his feelings.</i>
<b>introverted</b>	Given to examining own sensory and perceptual experiences.
<b>lowliness</b>	A position of inferior status; low in station or rank or fortune or estimation.
<b>meditation</b>	A written or spoken discourse expressing considered thoughts on a subject. <i>The habit of <b>meditation</b> is the basis for all real knowledge.</i>
<b>modesty</b>	Behaviour, manner, or appearance intended to avoid impropriety or indecency. <i><b>Modesty</b> forbade her to undress in front of so many people.</i>
<b>passivity</b>	The trait of remaining inactive; a lack of initiative. <i>The perceived <b>passivity</b> of the populace is deceptive.</i>
<b>personality</b>	A celebrity or famous person. <i>She is a Hollywood <b>personality</b>.</i>
<b>pulpit</b>	A raised enclosed platform in a church or chapel from which the preacher delivers a sermon. <i>Many ministers delivered political guidance from their <b>pulpits</b>.</i>
<b>punctilious</b>	Showing great attention to detail or correct behaviour. <i><b>Punctilious</b> in his attention to rules of etiquette.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>I ll have a <b>quiet</b> word with him.</i>

<b><u>reserved</u></b>	Marked by self-restraint and reticence-Victoria Sackville-West. <i>A <b>reserved</b> seat.</i>
<b><u>self</u></b>	Relating to of or by or to or from or for the self. <i>Language is an aspect of a person s sense of <b>self</b>.</i>
<b>shy</b>	Short. <i>I was pretty <b>shy</b> at school.</i>
<b><u>stillness</u></b>	Calmness without winds. <i>Absolute <b>stillness</b> greeted our gaze.</i>
<b><u>timid</u></b>	Lacking self-confidence. <i>Whitewater rafting is not for the <b>timid</b>.</i>
<b>trait</b>	A distinguishing quality or characteristic, typically one belonging to a person. <i>The traditionally British <b>trait</b> of self denigration.</i>
<b>uncommunicative</b>	Unwilling to talk or impart information. <i>The <b>uncommunicative</b> Emily disappeared.</i>
<b>winsome</b>	Charming in a childlike or naive way. <i>A <b>winsome</b> smile.</i>
