One who lives in solitude.

*He had something of the **solitary** about him.*

## Associations of "Introvert" (30 Words)

<b>bashful</b>	Disposed to avoid notice <i>blate</i> is a Scottish term for bashful. <i>Don t be <b>bashful</b> about telling folk how you feel.</i>
<b>cagey</b>	Characterized by great caution and wariness. <i>A <b>cagey</b> avoidance of a definite answer.</i>
<b>coy</b>	Modestly or warily rejecting approaches or overtures. <i>She treated him to a <b>coy</b> smile of invitation.</i>
<b>demure</b>	(of clothing) giving a modest appearance. <i>A <b>demure</b> young lady.</i>
<b>diffident</b>	Modest or shy because of a lack of self-confidence. <i>Stood in the doorway <b>diffident</b> and abashed.</i>
<b>eschew</b>	Deliberately avoid using; abstain from. <i>He appealed to the crowd to <b>eschew</b> violence.</i>
<b>fainthearted</b>	Lacking conviction or boldness or courage.

<b>inarticulate</b>	Not expressed in words. <i><b>Inarticulate</b> beasts.</i>
<b><u>introspection</u></b>	The examination or observation of one's own mental and emotional processes. <i>Quiet <b>introspection</b> can be extremely valuable.</i>
<b><u>introspective</u></b>	Characterized by or given to introspection. <i>He grew withdrawn and <b>introspective</b>.</i>
<b>introversion</b>	The tendency to be concerned with one's own thoughts and feelings rather than with external things. <i>We expected our sample to show elevated neuroticism and <b>introversion</b>.</i>
<b>introverted</b>	Of, denoting, or typical of an introvert.
<b>irresolute</b>	Showing or feeling hesitancy; uncertain. <i>The committee was timid and mediocre and <b>irresolute</b>.</i>
<b>lowliness</b>	A position of inferior status; low in station or rank or fortune or estimation.
<b>modesty</b>	Formality and propriety of manner. <i>With typical <b>modesty</b> he insisted on sharing the credit with others.</i>
<b><u>passive</u></b>	The passive voice. <i>Much benevolence of the <b>passive</b> order may be traced to a disinclination to inflict pain upon oneself.</i>
<b>passivity</b>	Acceptance of what happens, without active response or resistance. <i>The perceived <b>passivity</b> of the populace is deceptive.</i>
<b>personality</b>	The complex of all the attributes-behavioral, temperamental, emotional and mental-that characterize a unique individual. <i>She is a Hollywood <b>personality</b>.</i>
<b><u>reclusive</u></b>	Withdrawn from society; seeking solitude. <i>Sitting under the <b>reclusive</b> calm of a shade tree.</i>
<b><u>reserved</u></b>	Marked by self-restraint and reticence-Victoria Sackville-West. <i>He is a <b>reserved</b> almost taciturn man.</i>
<b>restrained</b>	(of colour, decoration, etc.) not excessively showy or ornate; understated. <i>His <b>restrained</b> gentlemanly voice.</i>
<b><u>reticent</u></b>	Temperamentally disinclined to talk. <i>She was extremely <b>reticent</b> about her personal affairs.</i>
<b>retiring</b>	Not arrogant or presuming. <i>A gentle <b>retiring</b> person who avoided conflict.</i>

<b>shy</b>	(of a plant) not bearing flowers or fruit well or prolifically. <i>The shares are 29p <b>shy</b> of their flotation price.</i>
<b><u>taciturn</u></b>	Habitually reserved and uncommunicative. <i>After such gatherings she would be <b>taciturn</b> and morose.</i>
<b><u>timid</u></b>	Showing a lack of courage or confidence; easily frightened. <i>Whitewater rafting is not for the <b>timid</b>.</i>
<b>timorous</b>	Showing or suffering from nervousness or a lack of confidence. <i>A <b>timorous</b> voice.</i>
<b>unassertive</b>	Inclined to timidity or lack of self-confidence. <i>His bland and <b>unassertive</b> personal style.</i>
<b>uncommunicative</b>	Unwilling to talk or impart information. <i>The <b>uncommunicative</b> Emily disappeared.</i>
<b><u>withdrawn</u></b>	Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. <i>When her husband died she became very <b>withdrawn</b>.</i>
