
annul	Declare invalid (an official agreement, decision, or result. <i>The contract was <b>annul</b>led</i> .
avoid	Stay clear from; keep away from; keep out of the way of someone or something. Book early to <b>avoid</b> disappointment.
<u>belie</u>	Represent falsely. His lively alert manner <b>belie</b> d his years.
<u>cancel</u>	Make up for. <b>Cancel</b> ling stamps on registered mail.
<u>contradict</u>	Be in contradiction with. Within five minutes he had <b>contradict</b> ed himself twice.
<u>debunk</u>	Expose while ridiculing; especially of pretentious or false claims and ideas. The physicist <b>debunk</b> ed the psychic s claims.



<u>discredit</u> <u>disprove</u>	Cause to be distrusted or disbelieved. <i>His remarks were taken out of context in an effort to</i> <b>discredit</b> him. Prove that (something) is false. <i>He has given the Department of Transport two months to</i> <b>disprove</b> <i>the allegation.</i>
drive a coach and horses through	Work as a driver.
<u>explode</u>	Cause to burst as a result of air pressure; of stop consonants like /p/, /t/, and /k. <i>His anger <b>explode</b>d.</i>
<u>expose</u>	Expose while ridiculing especially of pretentious or false claims and ideas. At low tide the sands are <b>expose</b> d.
gainsay	Deny or contradict (a fact or statement. None could <b>gainsay</b> her.
give the lie to	Offer in good faith.
knock the bottom out of	Find fault with; express criticism of; point out real or perceived flaws.
negate	Make ineffective by counterbalancing the effect of. This action will <b>negate</b> the effect of my efforts.
nullify	Make legally null and void; invalidate. Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby <b>nullify</b> the effects of training.
override	Extend over; overlap. The courts will ultimately <b>override</b> any objections.
overrule	Rule against. Chief Judge Moran <b>overrule</b> d the government s objections.
<u>overturn</u>	Cause to overturn from an upright or normal position. The crowd proceeded to <b>overturn</b> cars and set them on fire.
prove to be false	Establish the validity of something, as by an example, explanation or experiment.
quash	Reject as invalid, especially by legal procedure. <i>His conviction was <b>quash</b>ed on appeal.</i>
rebut	Prove to be false or incorrect. But he their sharp assault right boldly did <b>rebut</b> .
<u>refute</u>	Prove to be false or incorrect. A spokesman totally <b>refute</b> d the allegation of bias.



render invalid	Make over as a return.
reverse	Reverse the position order relation or condition of. The damage done to the ozone layer may be <b>reverse</b> d.
show to be false	Indicate a place, direction, person, or thing; either spatially or figuratively.
<u>undo</u>	Cause the downfall or ruin of. I wish I could <b>undo</b> my actions.
<u>veto</u>	Exercise a veto against a decision or proposal. The President <b>veto</b> ed the bill.
vitiate	Corrupt morally or by intemperance or sensuality. The insurance is <b>vitiate</b> d because of foolish acts on the part of the tenant.
void	Excrete (waste matter. The aases are usually <b>void</b> ed into the mechanism.

abrogate	Repeal or do away with (a law, right, or formal agreement. A proposal to <b>abrogate</b> temporarily the right to strike.
abrogation	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
<u>annihilate</u>	Kill in large numbers. A fraction of the mass of atomic nuclei is <b>annihilate</b> d.
annul	Declare invalid. The elections were <b>annul</b> led by the general amid renewed protests.
<u>cancel</u>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. Divide by 9 <b>cancel</b> s out multiply by 9.
<u>counterbalance</u>	A factor having the opposite effect to that of another and so preventing it from exercising a disproportionate influence. The sitter s weight <b>counterbalance</b> s the tilting pressure on the backrest.
countermand	Revoke or cancel (an order. An order to arrest the strike leaders had been <b>countermand</b> ed.
<u>delete</u>	Remove (data) from a computer's memory. Their EMI release has already been <b>delete</b> d.
<u>deny</u>	Deny oneself something restrain especially from indulging in some pleasure. The servants are ordered to <b>deny</b> him.
<u>exterminate</u>	Destroy completely. They use poison to <b>exterminate</b> moles.
negate	Be in contradiction with. This action will <b>negate</b> the effect of my efforts.
<u>neutralize</u>	Get rid of (someone who may be a threat) by killing. She <b>neutralize</b> d the solution.
null	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i>His curiously <b>null</b> life.</i>
<u>nullify</u>	Make legally null and void; invalidate. Insulin can block the release of the hormone and thereby <b>nullify</b> the effects of training.
<u>override</u>	Counteract the normal operation of (an automatic gear shift in a vehicle. Commission <b>override</b> s give established carriers an unfair advantage.



prove	Prove formally demonstrate by a mathematical formal proof. <b>Prove</b> a will.
reject	Reject with contempt. I <b>reject</b> the idea of starting a war.
repeal	The act of abrogating; an official or legal cancellation. <i>The House voted in favour of <b>repeal</b>.</i>
repudiation	Refusal to fulfil or discharge an agreement, obligation, or debt. The breach is not so serious as to amount to a <b>repudiation</b> of the whole contract.
rescind	Cancel officially. The government eventually <b>rescind</b> ed the directive.
rescission	The revocation, cancellation, or repeal of a law, order, or agreement. The plaintiff agreed to the <b>rescission</b> of the agreement.
reversible	Capable of being reversed. A <b>reversible</b> jacket.
revocable	Capable of being revoked or annulled. A <b>revocable</b> settlement.
<u>revoke</u>	Officially cancel (a decree, decision, or promise. <i>He <b>revoke</b>d the ban on smoking.</i>
<u>substantiate</u>	Establish or strengthen as with new evidence or facts. They had found nothing to <b>substantiate</b> the allegations.
terminate	Terminate the employment of discharge from an office or position. <i>He was <b>terminate</b>d by persons unknown.</i>
<u>vacate</u>	Leave (a job, post, or position) voluntarily. <i>He <b>vacate</b>d his office as Director.</i>
verify	To declare or affirm solemnly and formally as true. <i>Verify a claim.</i>
<u>veto</u>	A rejection by right of veto. The president <b>veto</b> ed the bill.
