Definitions of "Invariably" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “invariably” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In every case or on every occasion; always.*
- *Without variation or change, in every case.*

Synonyms of "Invariably" as an adverb (4 Words)

always	Without interruption. <i>I will always be there to help you.</i>
constantly	Without interruption. <i>The world is constantly changing.</i>
each time	To or from every one of two or more (considered individually).
universally	By everyone; in every case. <i>Progress is not always universally welcomed.</i>

Usage Examples of "Invariably" as an adverb

- *Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.*

Associations of "Invariably" (30 Words)

always	Throughout a long period of the past. <i>There is always some pollution in the air.</i>
<u>ceaseless</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The ceaseless thunder of surf.</i>
changeless	Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. <i>Changeless truths.</i>
confirmed	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>Received confirmed reports of casualties.</i>
constant	A quantity or parameter that does not change its value whatever the value of the variables, under a given set of conditions. <i>The constant background noise of the city.</i>
constantly	Continuously over a period of time; always. <i>He was constantly on her mind.</i>
<u>continually</u>	Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>I was continually moving around.</i>
continued	Without stop or interruption. <i>He asked for their continued support.</i>
continuously	At every point. <i>These images loop continuously.</i>
endless	Having the ends united so as to form a continuous whole. <i>Endless ocean wastes.</i>
endorse	Write (a comment) on a document. <i>The report was endorsed by the college.</i>
<u>eternal</u>	Seeming to last or persist forever, especially on account of being tedious or annoying. <i>Fear of eternal damnation.</i>
eternity	A state of eternal existence believed in some religions to characterize the afterlife. <i>Immortal souls destined for eternity.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Why ever did you do it.</i>
everlasting	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>The damned would suffer everlasting torment.</i>

every	(used of count nouns) each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i>Every two hours.</i>
forever	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>She would love him forever.</i>
grinding	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>Grinding poverty.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
irrevocably	In a way that cannot be changed, reversed, or recovered. <i>Our environment will be irrevocably damaged.</i>
permanency	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
permanent	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>A permanent ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Hell's perpetual fires.</i>
perpetually	Without interruption. <i>She seems perpetually to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
persistent	(of chemicals or radioactivity) remaining within the environment for a long time after introduction. <i>The persistent gills of fishes.</i>
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
universally	Everywhere. <i>Progress is not always universally welcomed.</i>
unlimited	Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
