## Invariably as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Invariably" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “invariably” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In every case or on every occasion; always.*
- *Without variation or change, in every case.*

### Synonyms of "Invariably" as an adverb (4 Words)

<b>always</b>	Without interruption. <i>I will <b>always</b> be there to help you.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>The world is <b>constantly</b> changing.</i>
<b>each time</b>	To or from every one of two or more (considered individually).
<b>universally</b>	By everyone; in every case. <i>Progress is not always <b>universally</b> welcomed.</i>

### Usage Examples of "Invariably" as an adverb

- *Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.*

## Associations of "Invariably" (30 Words)

<b>always</b>	Throughout a long period of the past. <i>There is <b>always</b> some pollution in the air.</i>
<b><u>ceaseless</u></b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>ceaseless</b> thunder of surf.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>confirmed</b>	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>Received <b>confirmed</b> reports of casualties.</i>
<b>constant</b>	A quantity or parameter that does not change its value whatever the value of the variables, under a given set of conditions. <i>The <b>constant</b> background noise of the city.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Continuously over a period of time; always. <i>He was <b>constantly</b> on her mind.</i>
<b><u>continually</u></b>	Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>
<b>continued</b>	Without stop or interruption. <i>He asked for their <b>continued</b> support.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	At every point. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>
<b>endless</b>	Having the ends united so as to form a continuous whole. <i><b>Endless</b> ocean wastes.</i>
<b>endorse</b>	Write (a comment) on a document. <i>The report was <b>endorsed</b> by the college.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	Seeming to last or persist forever, especially on account of being tedious or annoying. <i>Fear of <b>eternal</b> damnation.</i>
<b>eternity</b>	A state of eternal existence believed in some religions to characterize the afterlife. <i>Immortal souls destined for <b>eternity</b>.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Why <b>ever</b> did you do it.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>The damned would suffer <b>everlasting</b> torment.</i>

<b>every</b>	(used of count nouns) each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i>Every two hours.</i>
<b>forever</b>	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>She would love him forever.</i>
<b>grinding</b>	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>Grinding poverty.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
<b>irrevocably</b>	In a way that cannot be changed, reversed, or recovered. <i>Our environment will be irrevocably damaged.</i>
<b>permanency</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<b>permanent</b>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>A permanent ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Hell's perpetual fires.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	Without interruption. <i>She seems perpetually to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	(of chemicals or radioactivity) remaining within the environment for a long time after introduction. <i>The persistent gills of fishes.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>universally</b>	Everywhere. <i>Progress is not always universally welcomed.</i>
<b>unlimited</b>	Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not unlimited.</i>
