Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The ceaseless thunder of surf.</i>
Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. <i>Changeless</i> truths.
(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>Received confirmed reports of casualties</i> .
A quantity or parameter that does not change its value whatever the value of the variables, under a given set of conditions. <i>The constant background noise of the city.</i>
Continuously over a period of time; always. <i>He was constantly on her mind</i> .
Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. I was continually moving around.
Without stop or interruption. <i>He asked for their continued support.</i>
At every point. These images loop continuously .
Having the ends united so as to form a continuous whole. Endless ocean wastes.
Write (a comment) on a document. The report was endorse d by the college.
Seeming to last or persist forever, especially on account of being tedious or annoying. <i>Fear of eternal damnation.</i>
A state of eternal existence believed in some religions to characterize the afterlife. <i>Immortal souls destined for eternity</i> .
At all times all the time and on every occasion. Why ever did you do it.
Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. The damned would suffer everlasting torment.



<u>every</u>	(used of count nouns) each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i>Every two hours.</i>
<u>forever</u>	For a very long or seemingly endless time. <i>She would love him forever.</i>
<u>grinding</u>	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>Grinding</i> poverty.
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The</i> incessant <i>beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption. She talked about him incessantly .
<u>irrevocably</u>	In a way that cannot be changed, reversed, or recovered. <i>Our environment will be irrevocably damaged</i> .
permanency	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<u>permanent</u>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. A permanent ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.
perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Hell s perpetual fires.</i>
perpetually	Without interruption. She seems perpetually to have a mournful look on her face.
persistent	(of chemicals or radioactivity) remaining within the environment for a long time after introduction. The persistent gills of fishes.
unceasing	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
universally	Everywhere. Progress is not always universally welcomed.
unlimited	Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv. <i>Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not</i> unlimited .
