There is **always** some pollution in the air.

Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. ceaseless

Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. changeless

Changeless truths.

(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life

confirmed and unlikely to change their ways.

Received **confirmed** reports of casualties.

A quantity or parameter that does not change its value whatever the value of

constant the variables, under a given set of conditions.

The **constant** background noise of the city.

Continuously over a period of time; always. constantly

He was **constantly** on her mind.

Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. **continually**

I was **continually** moving around.

Without stop or interruption. continued

He asked for their **continued** support.

continuously At every point. These images loop **continuously**.

Having the ends united so as to form a continuous whole. endless

Endless ocean wastes.

Write (a comment) on a document. endorse

The report was **endorse**d by the college.

Seeming to last or persist forever, especially on account of being tedious or

eternal annoying.

Fear of **eternal** damnation.

A state of eternal existence believed in some religions to characterize the

eternity afterlife.

Immortal souls destined for **eternity**.

At all times all the time and on every occasion.

ever Why **ever** did you do it.

Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. everlasting

The damned would suffer **everlasting** torment.



(used of count nouns) each and all of the members of a group considered

every singly and without exception.

Every two hours.

forever For a very long or seemingly endless time.

She would love him **forever**.

Material resulting from the process of grinding.

Grinding poverty.

incessant Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

The **incessant** beat of the music.

incessantly Without interruption.

She talked about him **incessantly**.

irrevocably In a way that cannot be changed, reversed, or recovered.

Our environment will be **irrevocably** damaged.

permanency The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.

permanent Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely.

A **permanent** ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.

perpetual Continuing forever or indefinitely.

Hell s **perpetual** fires.

perpetually Without interruption.

She seems **perpetually** to have a mournful look on her face.

(of chemicals or radioactivity) remaining within the environment for a long

persistent time after introduction.

The **persistent** gills of fishes.

unceasing Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

The **unceasing** efforts of the staff.

unceasingly With unflagging resolve.

universally Everywhere.

Progress is not always **universally** welcomed.

unlimited Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv.

Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not **unlimited**.
