abstraction

The act of withdrawing or removing something.
*She sensed his momentary **abstraction**.*

artwork

Illustrations, photographs, or other non-textual material prepared for inclusion in a publication.
*A collection of **artwork** from tribal cultures.*

conceive

Judge or regard; look upon; judge.
*The dam project was originally **conceived** in 1977.*

conception

Ability to imagine; understanding.
*Our **conception** of how language relates to reality.*

contrive

Come up with (an idea, plan, explanation, theory, or principle) after a mental effort.
*They **contrived** to murder their boss.*

create	Create or manufacture a man made product. <i>He was created a baronet.</i>
creation	God's act of bringing the universe into existence. <i>Creation of a coalition government.</i>
creative	A person whose job involves creative work. <i>The most important people in the mix will be creatives and direct marketing specialists.</i>
creatively	In a creative manner. <i>This article inspires you to think creatively.</i>
creativeness	The ability to create.
creativity	The ability to create. <i>Firms are keen to encourage creativity.</i>
<u>devise</u>	Plan or invent (a complex procedure, system, or mechanism) by careful thought. <i>Devise a plan to take over the director s office.</i>
<u>discovery</u>	The act of discovering something. <i>The drug is not a new discovery.</i>
feign	Make a pretence of. <i>He feigned that he was ill.</i>
figment	A contrived or fantastic idea. <i>It really was Ross and not a figment of her overheated imagination.</i>
freshness	The quality of being pleasantly new or different. <i>The restaurant s selling point is the freshness of its ingredients.</i>
<u>groundbreaking</u>	Innovative; pioneering. <i>Groundbreaking research into fertility problems.</i>
hallucinatory	Of or resembling a hallucination. <i>A hallucinatory fantasy.</i>
idea	The aim or purpose. <i>It s a good idea to do some research before you go.</i>
<u>imagination</u>	The ability to deal resourcefully with unusual problems. <i>Imagination reveals what the world could be.</i>
<u>imaginative</u>	Having or showing creativity or inventiveness. <i>He was imaginative beyond all other architects.</i>
ingenious	Showing inventiveness and skill. <i>An ingenious solution to the problem.</i>
ingenuity	The property of being ingenious. <i>Considerable ingenuity must be employed in writing software.</i>

innovation	The creation of something in the mind. <i>Technological innovations designed to save energy.</i>
innovative	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>Innovative ways to help unemployed people.</i>
<u>inventive</u>	Showing creativity or original thought. <i>A courageous and inventive piece of film making.</i>
make	Compel or make somebody or something to act in a certain way. <i>He waited confidently for his band to make it.</i>
new	Beginning anew and in a transformed way. <i>The new Madonna album.</i>
<u>novelty</u>	The quality of being new, original, or unusual. <i>A novelty teapot.</i>
<u>originality</u>	The quality of being new and original (not derived from something else). <i>She s a writer of great originality.</i>
