## **Inverted as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Inverted" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “inverted” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a plant ovule) completely inverted; turned back 180 degrees on its stalk.*
- *Being in such a position that top and bottom are reversed.*



## Synonyms of "Inverted" as an adjective (2 Words)

**anatropous** (of a plant ovule) completely inverted; turned back 180 degrees on its stalk.

**upside-down** Being in such a position that top and bottom are reversed.

## Associations of "Inverted" (30 Words)

- backward** Having made less than normal progress.  
*The decision was a **backward** step.*
- backwards** In a manner or order or direction the reverse of normal.  
*Penny glanced **backwards**.*
- change** Change from one vehicle or transportation line to another.  
*A **change** of socks.*
- converse** Turned about in order or relation.  
*It will be difficult in these **converses** not to talk of secular matter.*
- countermand** Revoke or cancel an order issued by (another person).  
*An order to arrest the strike leaders had been **countermanded**.*
- dramatic** Exciting or impressive.  
*A **dramatic** entrance in a swirling cape.*

<b>fend</b>	Look after and provide for oneself, without any help from others. <i>The mountain climbers had to <b>fend</b> against the ice and snow.</i>
<b>flip</b>	Glib or flippant. <i><b>Flip</b> me the beachball.</i>
<b>funnel</b>	Move or be guided through or as if through a funnel. <i>They were close to the middle of the cloud <b>funnel</b>.</i>
<b>inverse</b>	Opposite in nature or effect or relation to another quantity. <i>The age of such a universe is simply the <b>inverse</b> of the Hubble constant.</i>
<b>inversion</b>	A transformation in which each point of a given figure is replaced by another point on the same straight line from a fixed point especially in such a way that the product of the distances of the two points from the centre of inversion is constant. <i>The <b>inversion</b> of the normal domestic arrangement.</i>
<b>obverse</b>	Of or denoting the obverse of a coin or medal. <i>The <b>obverse</b> fates of the principals.</i>
<b>opposite</b>	Characterized by opposite extremes completely opposed. <i>The <b>opposite</b> ends of the price range.</i>
<b>overturn</b>	Cause to overturn from an upright or normal position. <i>He fought for eight years to <b>overturn</b> a conviction for armed robbery.</i>
<b>rearrange</b>	Change the position of. <i><b>Rearrange</b> the furniture in my room.</i>
<b>retrograde</b>	Show retrograde motion. <i>Our history must <b>retrograde</b> for the space of a few pages.</i>
<b>reversal</b>	An unfortunate happening that hinders or impedes; something that is thwarting or frustrating. <i>A <b>reversal</b> by the House of Lords of the Court of Appeal's decision.</i>
<b>reverse</b>	A play in which a player reverses the direction of attack by passing the ball to a teammate moving in the opposite direction. <i>The trend appears to be going in the <b>reverse</b> direction.</i>
<b>revolutionize</b>	Fill with revolutionary ideas. <i>E mail <b>revolutionized</b> communication in academe.</i>
<b>setback</b>	An unfortunate happening that hinders or impedes; something that is thwarting or frustrating. <i>A serious <b>setback</b> for the peace process.</i>
<b>shape</b>	Give shape or form to. <i>Check that your structure will give <b>shape</b> to your essay.</i>
<b>style</b>	In an invertebrate a small slender pointed appendage a stylet. <i>The concerto is composed in a neoclassical <b>style</b>.</i>

<b><u>subvert</u></b>	Destroy completely. <i>We must not let our civil liberties be <b>subverted</b> by the current crisis.</i>
<b>takeover</b>	An act of assuming control of something, especially the buying out of one company by another. <i>They sought a controlling interest rather than a <b>takeover</b>.</i>
<b><u>text</u></b>	A text message. <i>Too much concentration on set <b>texts</b> can turn pupils against reading.</i>
<b>transposition</b>	(mathematics) the transfer of a quantity from one side of an equation to the other along with a change of sign. <i>He wrote a textbook on the electrical effects of <b>transposition</b>.</i>
<b>turn</b>	The act of turning away or in the opposite direction. <i><b>Turn</b> a somersault.</i>
<b>turnabout</b>	A decision to reverse an earlier decision. <i>The move was a significant <b>turnabout</b> for the company.</i>
<b><u>turnaround</u></b>	The process of completing or the time needed to complete a task, especially one involving receiving something, processing it, and sending it out again. <i>A seven day <b>turnaround</b>.</i>
<b><u>vacate</u></b>	Leave (a job, post, or position) voluntarily. <i>He <b>vacated</b> his office as Director.</i>
