## Associations of "Invested" (30 Words)

<a href="#">afford</a>	Afford access to. <i>Our meeting <b>afforded</b> much interesting information.</i>
<a href="#">amortize</a>	Reduce or pay off (a debt) with regular payments. <i>Lands <b>amortized</b> without licence.</i>
authorize	Give or delegate power or authority to. <i>She <b>authorized</b> her assistant to sign the papers.</i>
bonus	An additional payment (or other remuneration) to employees as a means of increasing output. <i>Good weather is an added <b>bonus</b> but the real appeal is the landscape.</i>
<a href="#">capitalize</a>	Draw advantages from. <i>People should have the right to <b>capitalize</b> part of the value of these benefits.</i>
company	Accompany someone. <i>She is excellent <b>company</b>.</i>
deductible	The part of an insurance claim to be paid by the insured; an excess. <i>Childcare vouchers will be <b>deductible</b> expenses for employers.</i>
dividend	An individual's share of a dividend. <i>Buying a rail pass may still pay <b>dividends</b>.</i>
<a href="#">empower</a>	Give or delegate power or authority to. <i>Movements to <b>empower</b> the poor.</i>
enable	Make (something) possible. <i>The Department is leading the effort to <b>enable</b> a smooth and timely transition.</i>
endue	Give qualities or abilities to. <i>Our sight would be <b>endued</b> with a far greater sharpness.</i>
enthrone	Put a monarch on the throne. <i>He was <b>enthroned</b> as the guru of the avant garde.</i>



<b>exemption</b>	Immunity from an obligation or duty. <i>Vehicles that may qualify for <b>exemption</b> from tax.</i>
<b>finance</b>	The management of money and credit and banking and investments. <i>Can we <b>finance</b> the addition to our home.</i>
<b>give</b>	Yield or give way to pressure. <i>What <b>gives</b>.</i>
<b>grant</b>	A right or privilege that has been granted. <i>He hasn't made much progress I'll <b>grant</b> you that.</i>
<b>harpoon</b>	Spear with a harpoon. <i><b>Harpoon</b> whales.</i>
<b>impale</b>	Kill by piercing with a spear or sharp pole. <i>The enemies were <b>impaled</b> and left to die.</i>
<b>income</b>	The financial gain (earned or unearned) accruing over a given period of time. <i>Figures showed an overall increase in <b>income</b> this year.</i>
<b>induct</b>	Introduce or initiate. <i>There was a ceremony to <b>induct</b> the president of the Academy.</i>
<b>installment</b>	A payment of part of a debt; usually paid at regular intervals.
<b>mortgage</b>	The amount of money borrowed in a mortgage. <i>Some people worry that selling off state assets <b>mortgages</b> the country's future.</i>
<b>payment</b>	A sum of money paid or a claim discharged. <i>A compensation <b>payment</b> of 2500.</i>
<b>porcupine</b>	Relatively large rodents with sharp erectile bristles mingled with the fur.
<b>shareholder</b>	An owner of shares in a company.
<b>spike</b>	Secure with spikes. <i><b>Spike</b> the liquid with lime or lemon juice.</i>
<b>stake</b>	Mark with a stake. <i>Bishop Ridley was burned at the <b>stake</b>.</i>
<b>stick</b>	Stick to firmly. <i>Janet's not such a bad old <b>stick</b> sometimes.</i>
<b>sticker</b>	A particularly difficult or baffling question or problem. <i>A disabled <b>sticker</b> for our car.</i>
<b>thorn</b>	A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn. <i>He's a <b>thorn</b> in my flesh.</i>
