Associations of "Invested" (30 Words)

afford	Afford access to. <i>Our meeting afforded much interesting information.</i>
amortize	Reduce or pay off (a debt) with regular payments. <i>Lands amortized without licence.</i>
authorize	Give or delegate power or authority to. <i>She authorized her assistant to sign the papers.</i>
bonus	An additional payment (or other remuneration) to employees as a means of increasing output. <i>Good weather is an added bonus but the real appeal is the landscape.</i>
capitalize	Draw advantages from. <i>People should have the right to capitalize part of the value of these benefits.</i>
company	Accompany someone. <i>She is excellent company.</i>
deductible	The part of an insurance claim to be paid by the insured; an excess. <i>Childcare vouchers will be deductible expenses for employers.</i>
dividend	An individual's share of a dividend. <i>Buying a rail pass may still pay dividends.</i>
empower	Give or delegate power or authority to. <i>Movements to empower the poor.</i>
enable	Make (something) possible. <i>The Department is leading the effort to enable a smooth and timely transition.</i>
endue	Give qualities or abilities to. <i>Our sight would be endued with a far greater sharpness.</i>
enthrone	Put a monarch on the throne. <i>He was enthroned as the guru of the avant garde.</i>

exemption	Immunity from an obligation or duty. <i>Vehicles that may qualify for exemption from tax.</i>
finance	The management of money and credit and banking and investments. <i>Can we finance the addition to our home.</i>
give	Yield or give way to pressure. <i>What gives.</i>
grant	A right or privilege that has been granted. <i>He hasn't made much progress I'll grant you that.</i>
harpoon	Spear with a harpoon. <i>Harpoon whales.</i>
impale	Kill by piercing with a spear or sharp pole. <i>The enemies were impaled and left to die.</i>
income	The financial gain (earned or unearned) accruing over a given period of time. <i>Figures showed an overall increase in income this year.</i>
induct	Introduce or initiate. <i>There was a ceremony to induct the president of the Academy.</i>
installment	A payment of part of a debt; usually paid at regular intervals.
mortgage	The amount of money borrowed in a mortgage. <i>Some people worry that selling off state assets mortgages the country's future.</i>
payment	A sum of money paid or a claim discharged. <i>A compensation payment of 2500.</i>
porcupine	Relatively large rodents with sharp erectile bristles mingled with the fur.
shareholder	An owner of shares in a company.
spike	Secure with spikes. <i>Spike the liquid with lime or lemon juice.</i>
stake	Mark with a stake. <i>Bishop Ridley was burned at the stake.</i>
stick	Stick to firmly. <i>Janet's not such a bad old stick sometimes.</i>
sticker	A particularly difficult or baffling question or problem. <i>A disabled sticker for our car.</i>
thorn	A thorny bush shrub or tree especially a hawthorn. <i>He's a thorn in my flesh.</i>
