### Definitions of "Invincible" as an adjective

- *Incapable of being overcome or subdued.*
- *Too powerful to be defeated or overcome.*

### Synonyms of "Invincible" as an adjective (7 Words)

<b>indestructible</b>	Very long lasting. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>indomitable</b>	Impossible to subdue. <i>A woman of <b>indomitable</b> spirit.</i>
<b>invulnerable</b>	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>No state in the region is now <b>invulnerable</b> to attack by another.</i>
<a href="#">unassailable</a>	Impossible to assail. <i>An <b>unassailable</b> lead.</i>
<a href="#">unbeatable</a>	Not able to be defeated or bettered in a contest or commercial market. <i>The team is <b>unbeatable</b>.</i>

**unconquerable** Incapable of being surmounted or excelled.  
*An **unconquerable** pride.*

**unvanquishable** Incapable of being overcome or subdued.

## Associations of "Invincible" (30 Words)

**battle** Battle or contend against in or as if in a battle.  
*Firefighters **battled** a 9 800 acre brush fire.*

**captor** A person who captures and holds people or animals.  
*He managed to escape from his **captors** two nights later.*

**competition** An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants.  
*I walked round to check out the **competition**.*

**conqueror** A person who conquers a place or people; a vanquisher.  
*A chance for revenge against his Olympic **conqueror**.*

**contender** A person or group competing with others to achieve something.  
*The major **contenders** in the football championship.*

**dictator** A person who behaves in an autocratic way.  
*My boss is a **dictator** who makes everyone work overtime.*

**encroach** Intrude on (a person's territory, rights, personal life, etc).  
*Rather than **encroach** on his privacy she might have kept to her room.*

**foe** An armed adversary (especially a member of an opposing military force).  
*They had been political **foes** for years.*

**impregnable** Unable to be defeated or overcome.  
*An **impregnable** fortress.*

**inalienable** Not subject to forfeiture.  
*The shareholders have the **inalienable** right to dismiss directors.*

**incontestable** Not open to question; obviously true.

**indisputable** Unable to be challenged or denied.  
***Indisputable** evidence of a witness.*

<b>infrangible</b>	Not capable of being violated or infringed. <i>There is no <b>infrangible</b> genetic prescription of human behaviour.</i>
<b>invader</b>	A person or group that invades a country, region, or other place. <i>It is a country that has repelled all <b>invaders</b>.</i>
<b>inviolable</b>	Must be kept sacred. <i>The person of the king is <b>inviolable</b>.</i>
<b>inviolate</b>	Must be kept sacred. <i>An international memorial which must remain <b>inviolate</b>.</i>
<b>invulnerable</b>	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>No state in the region is now <b>invulnerable</b> to attack by another.</i>
<b>mighty</b>	Extremely. <i>He s <b>mighty</b> tired.</i>
<b>oppressor</b>	A person of authority who subjects others to undue pressures. <i>They overthrew their colonial <b>oppressors</b>.</i>
<b>rival</b>	Be the rival of be in competition with. <i>Nothing can <b>rival</b> cotton for durability.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	(often followed by `to') devoted exclusively to a single use or purpose or person. <i><b>Sacred</b> music.</i>
<b>sacrosanct</b>	Must be kept sacred. <i>The individual s right to work has been upheld as <b>sacrosanct</b>.</i>
<b>secure</b>	Get by special effort. <i>A <b>secure</b> hold on her wrist.</i>
<b>superior</b>	A person superior to another in rank or status especially a colleague in a higher position. <i>A <b>superior</b> officer.</i>
<b>tyrant</b>	A tyrant flycatcher. <i>The <b>tyrant</b> was deposed by popular demonstrations.</i>
<b>unassailable</b>	Impossible to assail. <i>An <b>unassailable</b> lead.</i>
<b>unbeatable</b>	Not able to be defeated or bettered in a contest or commercial market. <i>Views from the patio are <b>unbeatable</b>.</i>
<b>unshakable</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable.
<b>victor</b>	The contestant who wins the contest. <i>There were many dead on the field but no clear <b>victor</b>.</i>
<b>winner</b>	A goal or shot that wins a match or point. <i>Dummy has the spade ace and two diamond <b>winner</b>s at the finish.</i>
