encroach Intrude on (a person's territory, rights, personal life, etc.

foe An armed adversary (especially a member of an opposing military force.

They had been political **foe**s for years.

impregnable Unable to be defeated or overcome.

An impregnable fortress.

inalienable Not subject to forfeiture.

The shareholders have the **inalienable** right to dismiss directors.

incontestable Not open to question; obviously true.

indisputable Unable to be challenged or denied.

Indisputable evidence of a witness.



infrangible Not capable of being violated or infringed.

There is no **infrangible** genetic prescription of human behaviour.

A person or group that invades a country, region, or other place.

It is a country that has repelled all **invader**s.

inviolable Must be kept sacred.

The person of the king is **inviolable**.

inviolate Must be kept sacred.

An international memorial which must remain **inviolate**.

invulnerable Impossible to harm or damage.

No state in the region is now **invulnerable** to attack by another.

Extremely.

mighty He s mighty tired.

A person of authority who subjects others to undue pressures.

They overthrew their colonial **oppressor**s.

rival

Be the rival of be in competition with.

Nothing can rival cotton for durability.

(often followed by `to') devoted exclusively to a single use or purpose or

sacred person.

Sacred music.

sacrosanct Must be kept sacred.

The individual s right to work has been upheld as **sacrosanct**.

Get by special effort.

A **secure** hold on her wrist.

A person superior to another in rank or status especially a colleague in a

superior higher position.

A **superior** officer.

A tyrant flycatcher.

The **tyrant** was deposed by popular demonstrations.

unassailable
Impossible to assail.
An unassailable lead.

unbeatable Not able to be defeated or bettered in a contest or commercial market.

Views from the patio are **unbeatable**.

unshakable Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable.

victor The contestant who wins the contest.

There were many dead on the field but no clear **victor**.

winner A goal or shot that wins a match or point.

Dummy has the spade ace and two diamond **winner**s at the finish.
