Definitions of "Invincible" as an adjective

- *Incapable of being overcome or subdued.*
- *Too powerful to be defeated or overcome.*

Synonyms of "Invincible" as an adjective (7 Words)

indestructible	Very long lasting. <i>Indestructible plastic containers.</i>
indomitable	Impossible to subdue. <i>A woman of indomitable spirit.</i>
invulnerable	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i>
<u>unassailable</u>	Impossible to assail. <i>An unassailable lead.</i>
<u>unbeatable</u>	Not able to be defeated or bettered in a contest or commercial market. <i>The team is unbeatable.</i>

unconquerable Incapable of being surmounted or excelled.
*An **unconquerable** pride.*

unvanquishable Incapable of being overcome or subdued.

Associations of "Invincible" (30 Words)

battle	Battle or contend against in or as if in a battle. <i>Firefighters battled a 9 800 acre brush fire.</i>
captor	A person who captures and holds people or animals. <i>He managed to escape from his captors two nights later.</i>
competition	An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants. <i>I walked round to check out the competition.</i>
conqueror	A person who conquers a place or people; a vanquisher. <i>A chance for revenge against his Olympic conqueror.</i>
contender	A person or group competing with others to achieve something. <i>The major contenders in the football championship.</i>
dictator	A person who behaves in an autocratic way. <i>My boss is a dictator who makes everyone work overtime.</i>
encroach	Intrude on (a person's territory, rights, personal life, etc). <i>Rather than encroach on his privacy she might have kept to her room.</i>
foe	An armed adversary (especially a member of an opposing military force). <i>They had been political foes for years.</i>
impregnable	Unable to be defeated or overcome. <i>An impregnable fortress.</i>
inalienable	Not subject to forfeiture. <i>The shareholders have the inalienable right to dismiss directors.</i>
incontestable	Not open to question; obviously true.
indisputable	Unable to be challenged or denied. <i>Indisputable evidence of a witness.</i>

infrangible	Not capable of being violated or infringed. <i>There is no infrangible genetic prescription of human behaviour.</i>
invader	A person or group that invades a country, region, or other place. <i>It is a country that has repelled all invaders.</i>
inviolable	Must be kept sacred. <i>The person of the king is inviolable.</i>
inviolate	Must be kept sacred. <i>An international memorial which must remain inviolate.</i>
invulnerable	Impossible to harm or damage. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i>
mighty	Extremely. <i>He s mighty tired.</i>
oppressor	A person of authority who subjects others to undue pressures. <i>They overthrew their colonial oppressors.</i>
rival	Be the rival of be in competition with. <i>Nothing can rival cotton for durability.</i>
sacred	(often followed by `to') devoted exclusively to a single use or purpose or person. <i>Sacred music.</i>
sacrosanct	Must be kept sacred. <i>The individual s right to work has been upheld as sacrosanct.</i>
secure	Get by special effort. <i>A secure hold on her wrist.</i>
superior	A person superior to another in rank or status especially a colleague in a higher position. <i>A superior officer.</i>
tyrant	A tyrant flycatcher. <i>The tyrant was deposed by popular demonstrations.</i>
unassailable	Impossible to assail. <i>An unassailable lead.</i>
unbeatable	Not able to be defeated or bettered in a contest or commercial market. <i>Views from the patio are unbeatable.</i>
unshakable	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable.
victor	The contestant who wins the contest. <i>There were many dead on the field but no clear victor.</i>
winner	A goal or shot that wins a match or point. <i>Dummy has the spade ace and two diamond winners at the finish.</i>
