Invisible as an Adjective

Definitions of "Invisible" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “invisible” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Unable to be seen.*
- *Relating to or denoting earnings which a country makes from the sale of services or other items not constituting tangible commodities.*
- *Treated as if unable to be seen; ignored or not taken into consideration.*
- *Not prominent or readily noticeable.*
- *Impossible or nearly impossible to see; imperceptible by the eye.*
- *Concealed from sight; hidden.*



Synonyms of "Invisible" as an adjective (13 Words)

impalpable	Not easily comprehended. <i>As impalpable as a dream.</i>
impossible to detect	Totally unlikely.
inappreciable	Too small or insignificant to be valued or perceived. <i>Inappreciable fluctuations in temperature.</i>
inaudible	Impossible to hear; imperceptible by the ear. <i>An inaudible conversation.</i>
<u>inconspicuous</u>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>An inconspicuous red brick building.</i>
indiscernible	Barely able to be perceived. <i>The transition was almost indiscernible.</i>

indistinguishable

Not able to be identified as different or distinct.
*They wore **indistinguishable** hats.*

not visible

Obvious to the eye.

unapparent

Not readily apparent.

*The fact that technical barriers are relatively **unapparent** in other countries does not mean that they do not present a potential threat.*

undetectable

Barely able to be perceived.

*In the other two patients the antibodies were **undetectable** after one year.*

unnoticeable

Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable.

*Her clothes were simple and **unnoticeable**.*

unobtrusive

Not conspicuous or attracting attention.

*The service was **unobtrusive** and efficient.*

unseeable

Not able to be seen; invisible.

*She gazed out over the trees as if at some distant **unseeable** vista.*

concealed	Hidden on any grounds for any motive. <i>A concealed compartment in his briefcase.</i>
<u>covert</u>	A thicket in which game can hide. <i>Covert operations against the dictatorship.</i>
den	A wild mammal s hidden home a lair. <i>The cubs denned in the late autumn.</i>
<u>dim</u>	Make dim or lusterless. <i>His eyes became dim.</i>
<u>disappear</u>	Become invisible or unnoticeable. <i>He disappeared without a trace.</i>
disguised	Having changed one's appearance in order to conceal one's identity. <i>The disguised form of aggression available to the powerless against the powerful.</i>
esoteric	Confined to and understandable by only an enlightened inner circle. <i>A compilation of esoteric philosophical theories.</i>
<u>hidden</u>	Designed to elude detection. <i>Her hidden feelings.</i>
hide	Conceal oneself. <i>Hide the money.</i>
<u>inconspicuous</u>	Not clearly visible or attracting attention. <i>He pushed the string through an inconspicuous hole.</i>
indistinct	Not clear or sharply defined. <i>Only indistinct notions of what to do.</i>
<u>obscure</u>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>An obscure turn of phrase.</i>
<u>opaque</u>	A substance for producing opaque areas on negatives. <i>Bottles filled with a pale opaque liquid.</i>
recondite	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some recondite problem in historiography.</i>
<u>secrecy</u>	The trait of keeping things secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in secrecy.</i>
<u>stealthy</u>	Behaving or done in a cautious and surreptitious manner, so as not to be seen or heard. <i>Stealthy footsteps.</i>
<u>subtlety</u>	A subtle difference in meaning or opinion or attitude. <i>The textural subtlety of Degas.</i>

<u>ulterior</u>	Existing beyond what is obvious or admitted; intentionally hidden. <i>Without any purpose immediate or ulterior.</i>
<u>unappreciated</u>	Not likely to be rewarded. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt unappreciated and undervalued.</i>
<u>undetected</u>	Not perceived or discerned. <i>They feared some undetected trace of poison.</i>
<u>undiscovered</u>	Not yet discovered. <i>Undiscovered islands.</i>
unknown	Being or having an unknown or unnamed source. <i>A poem by an unknown author.</i>
<u>unnoticeable</u>	Not noticeable; not drawing attention- J.G.Cozzens. <i>An unnoticeable cigarette burn on the carpet.</i>
unobserved	Not seen or observed. <i>Managed to slip away unobserved.</i>
<u>unobtrusive</u>	Not obtrusive or undesirably noticeable. <i>The service was unobtrusive and efficient.</i>
unopened	Not yet opened or unsealed. <i>Unopened mail.</i>
<u>unseen</u>	An unseen passage for translation. <i>Unseen natural resources.</i>
unsung	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>Unsung heroes of the war.</i>
<u>vanish</u>	Get lost, as without warning or explanation. <i>The environment is under threat hedgerows and woodlands are vanishing.</i>
