- alluring** Powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating; seductive.
*The town offers **alluring** shops and restaurants.*
- beguiling** Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire.
*The voice was low and **beguiling**.*
- enticing** Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire.
*An **enticing** prospect.*
- tempting** Appealing to or attracting someone, even if wrong or unwise.
*It is often **tempting** to bring about change rapidly.*
- winning** Attractive; endearing.
*A **winning** smile.*



Usage Examples of "Inviting" as an adjective

- *The sea down there looks so inviting.*
- *An inviting offer.*



Associations of "Inviting" (30 Words)

allure	Powerfully attract or charm; tempt. <i>People for whom gold holds no allure.</i>
alluring	Powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating; seductive. <i>An alluring prospect.</i>
appealing	Evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>The idea of having enough money to retire at fifty is very appealing.</i>
attract	Be attractive to. <i>I did not want to attract attention.</i>
attraction	The quality of arousing interest; being attractive or something that attracts. <i>She has very romantic ideas about sexual attraction.</i>
attractive	Having qualities or features which arouse interest. <i>Foliage can be as attractive as flowers.</i>
<u>captivate</u>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was captivated by her beauty.</i>
<u>charisma</u>	A divinely conferred power or talent. <i>He has tremendous charisma and stage presence.</i>
<u>charm</u>	Protect through supernatural powers or charms. <i>The charm begins with ritual instructions.</i>
<u>charming</u>	Pleasing or delighting. <i>He was a charming affectionate colleague.</i>
<u>chic</u>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. <i>Chic elegance.</i>
<u>coquettish</u>	Behaving in such a way as to suggest a playful sexual attraction; flirtatious. <i>A coquettish grin.</i>
<u>enchant</u>	Put (someone or something) under a spell; bewitch. <i>Marcia had enchanted the rope so that it simply regenerated when any length was cut off.</i>
engaging	Attracting or delighting. <i>An engaging smile.</i>
<u>entice</u>	Provoke someone to do something through (often false or exaggerated) promises or persuasion. <i>A show which should entice a new audience into the theatre.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>Difficult to say no to an enticing advertisement.</i>

<u>entrance</u>	Put into a trance. <i>The entrance to a tunnel.</i>
<u>fascinate</u>	(especially of a snake) deprive (prey) of the ability to resist or escape by the power of a gaze. <i>I've always been fascinated by computers.</i>
glamorize	Interpret romantically. <i>The lyrics glamorize drugs.</i>
glamorous	Having an air of allure, romance and excitement. <i>I really wanted the glamorous job of a flight attendant.</i>
ingratiating	Capable of winning favor. <i>With open arms and an ingratiating smile.</i>
<u>lure</u>	Something used to lure fish or other animals into danger so they can be trapped or killed. <i>The lure of the exotic East.</i>
<u>personable</u>	Pleasant in appearance and personality. <i>He was so personable and well spoken.</i>
<u>seduction</u>	A tempting or attractive thing. <i>The seductions of the mainland.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
spellbind	Hold the complete attention of (someone) as though by magic; fascinate. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i>
<u>tempt</u>	Try to seduce. <i>The window displays tempted the shoppers.</i>
<u>tempting</u>	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>A tempting financial offer.</i>
winsome	Attractive or appealing in a fresh, innocent way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>
