- *A sense of concern with and curiosity about someone or something.*
- *The fact or condition of being involved with or participating in something.*
- *The condition of sharing in common with others (as fellows or partners etc.*
- *The act of sharing in the activities of a group.*
- *A usually secretive or illicit sexual relationship.*

| <b>friendship</b>    | The state of being friends (or friendly).<br><i>She formed close <b>friendships</b> with women.</i>   |
| <b>hand</b>          | A person's handwriting.<br><i><b>Hand</b> signals.</i>  |
| <b>interest</b>      | The selfish pursuit of one's own welfare self interest.<br><i>How much <b>interest</b> do you pay on your mortgage.</i>   |
| <b>intimacy</b>      | A usually secretive or illicit sexual relationship.<br><i>He acquired an <b>intimacy</b> with Swahili literature.</i>   |
| <b>involution</b>    | The shrinkage of an organ in old age or when inactive, e.g. of the uterus after childbirth.<br><i>Periods of artistic <b>involution</b>.</i>  |
| <b>liaison</b>       | (in French and other languages) the sounding of a consonant that is normally silent at the end of a word, because the next word begins with a vowel.<br><i>The head porter works in close <b>liaison</b> with the reception office.</i> |
| <b>participation</b> | The action of taking part in something.<br><i><b>Participation</b> in chapel activities.</i>  |

- affair** Matters of public interest and importance.  
*The party was quite an **affair**.*
- ambient** Relating to ambient music.  
***Ambient** sound.*
- amour** A love affair or lover, especially one that is secret.  
*He is enraged at this revelation of his past **amours**.*
- approximate** Located close together.  
*The **approximate** time was 10 o'clock.*
- around** All around or on all sides.  
*Waited **around** for the next flight.*
- bigamist** Someone who marries one person while already legally married to another.
