**irrational number** A real number that cannot be expressed as a rational number.

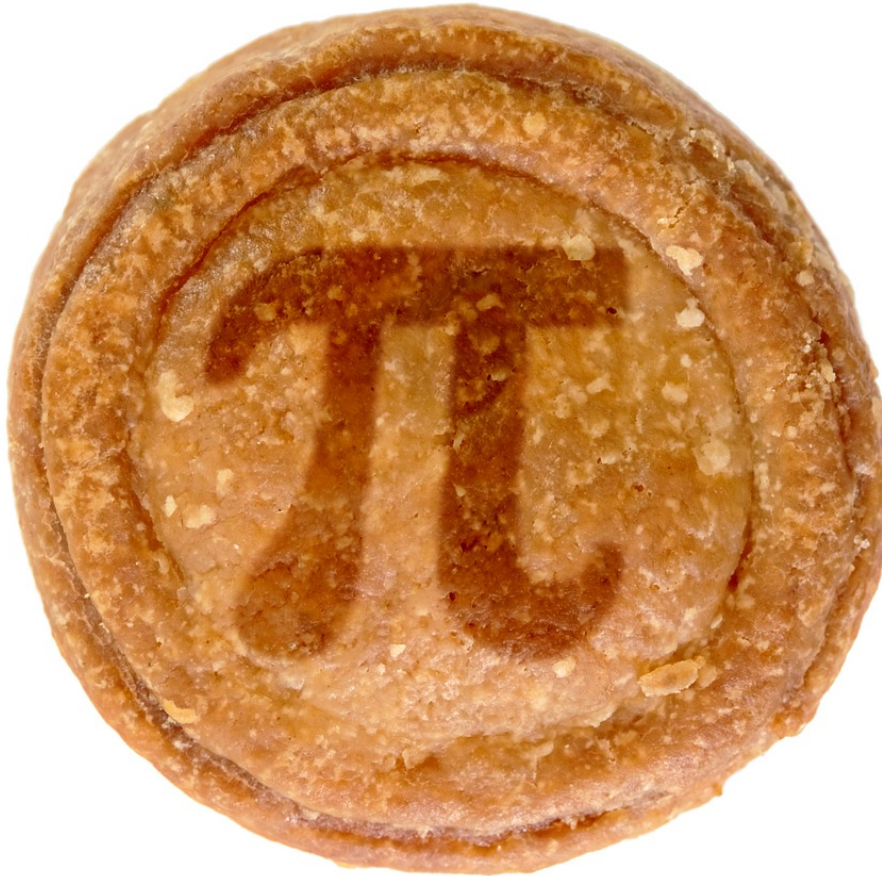


## Irrational as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Irrational" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "irrational" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not logical or reasonable.*
- *Not consistent with or using reason.*
- *Not endowed with the power of reason.*
- *(of a number, quantity, or expression) not expressible as a ratio of two integers, and having an infinite and non-recurring expansion when expressed as a decimal. Examples of irrational numbers are the number  $\pi$  and the square root of 2.*
- *Real but not expressible as the quotient of two integers.*



## Synonyms of "Irrational" as an adjective (7 Words)

<b>baseless</b>	Without foundation in fact. <i><b>Baseless</b> allegations.</i>
<b>groundless</b>	Not based on any good reason. <i>The allegations proved <b>groundless</b>.</i>
<b>illogical</b>	Lacking in correct logical relation. <i>An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.</i>
<b><u>unfounded</u></b>	Having no foundation or basis in fact. <i>Her fear that she had cancer was <b>unfounded</b>.</i>
<b><u>unjustifiable</u></b>	Not able to be shown to be right or reasonable. <i>An <b>unjustifiable</b> restriction on their freedom.</i>

**unreasonable** Beyond the limits of acceptability or fairness.  
*She knew she was being **unreasonable** but she resented his domesticity.*

**unsound** Physically unsound or diseased.  
*This line of argument is **unsound**.*

## Usage Examples of "Irrational" as an adjective

## Associations of "Irrational" (30 Words)

**absurd** An absurd state of affairs.  
*The incidents that followed bordered on the **absurd**.*

**absurdity** The quality or state of being ridiculous or wildly unreasonable.  
*The crowd laughed at the **absurdity** of the clown's behavior.*

**disordered** Not arranged in order.  
*She went to comb her **disordered** hair.*

**foolish** Devoid of good sense or judgment.  
*He was **foolish** enough to confide in her.*

**funny** Experiencing odd bodily sensations.  
*Up to some **funny** business.*

**garbled** Lacking orderly continuity.  
*I got a **garbled** set of directions.*

**illogical** Lacking orderly continuity.  
*An **illogical** fear of the supernatural.*

**inadvisable** Not prudent or wise; not recommended.  
*Running on the ice is **inadvisable**.*

**incoherent** Not logical or internally consistent.  
***Incoherent** with grief.*

**incongruent** (of melting, dissolution, or other process) affecting the components of an alloy or other substance differently.

**incongruity** The quality of disagreeing; being unsuitable and inappropriate.  
*The **incongruity** of his fleshy face and skinny body disturbed her.*

<b><u>incongruous</u></b>	Not in harmony or keeping with the surroundings or other aspects of something. <i>The duffel coat looked <b>incongruous</b> with the black dress she wore underneath.</i>
<b>indefensible</b>	Not justifiable by argument. <i>The towns were tactically <b>indefensible</b>.</i>
<b>inexcusable</b>	Too bad to be justified or tolerated. <i>Matt s behaviour was <b>inexcusable</b>.</i>
<b>injudicious</b>	Showing very poor judgement; unwise. <i>An <b>injudicious</b> measure.</i>
<b><u>inordinate</u></b>	Unusually or disproportionately large; excessive. <i>A book of <b>inordinate</b> length.</i>
<b><u>ludicrous</u></b>	Broadly or extravagantly humorous; resembling farce. <i>Every night he wore a <b>ludicrous</b> outfit.</i>
<b><u>nonsense</u></b>	Spoken or written words that have no meaning or make no sense. <i>He was talking absolute <b>nonsense</b>.</i>
<b>prattle</b>	Talk at length in a foolish or inconsequential way. <i>She began to <b>prattle</b> on about her visit to the dentist.</i>
<b>preposterous</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>A <b>preposterous</b> suggestion.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	Deserving or inviting derision or mockery; absurd. <i>That <b>ridiculous</b> tartan cap.</i>
<b>silly</b>	Dazed from or as if from repeated blows. <i>Don t be <b>silly</b> she said.</i>
<b><u>superstitious</u></b>	Having or showing a belief in superstitions. <i>Many <b>superstitious</b> beliefs and practices are connected with sneezing.</i>
<b><u>unfounded</u></b>	Having no foundation or basis in fact. <i>Her fear that she had cancer was <b>unfounded</b>.</i>
<b><u>unjustifiable</u></b>	Incapable of being justified or explained. <i>An <b>unjustifiable</b> restriction on their freedom.</i>
<b><u>unjustified</u></b>	Lacking justification or authorization. <i><b>Unjustified</b> price increases.</i>
<b><u>unreasonable</u></b>	Beyond normal limits. <i>An <b>unreasonable</b> request.</i>
<b><u>untenable</u></b>	(of theories etc) incapable of being defended or justified. <i>This argument is clearly <b>untenable</b>.</i>

**unwarranted** Lacking justification or authorization.  
***Unwarranted** jealousy.*

**unwise** Showing or resulting from lack of judgment or wisdom.  
*An **unwise** investor is soon impoverished.*
