### Definitions of "Irregular" as a noun

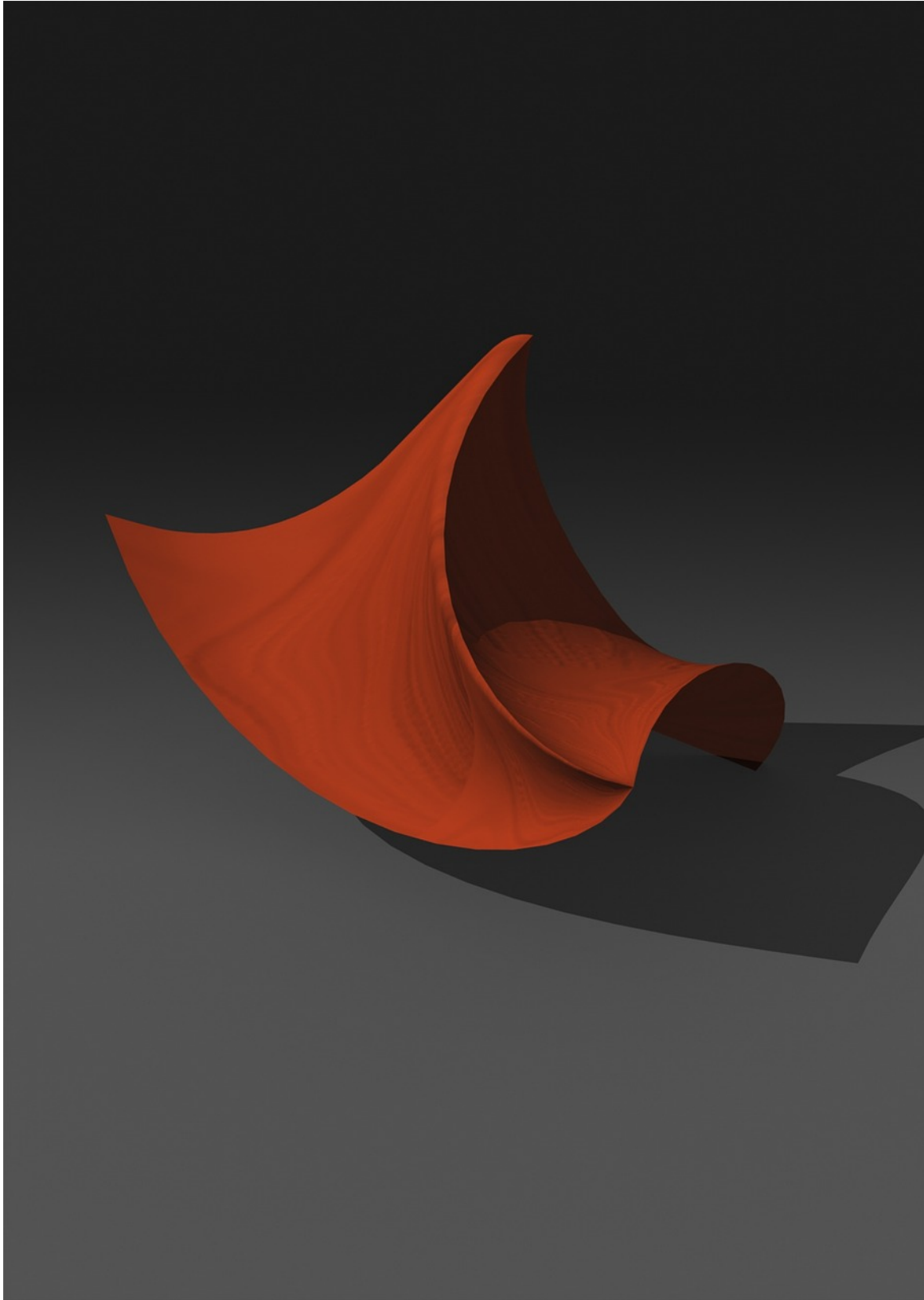
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “irregular” as a noun can have the following definitions:

<b>underground fighter</b>	A secret group organized to overthrow a government or occupation force.



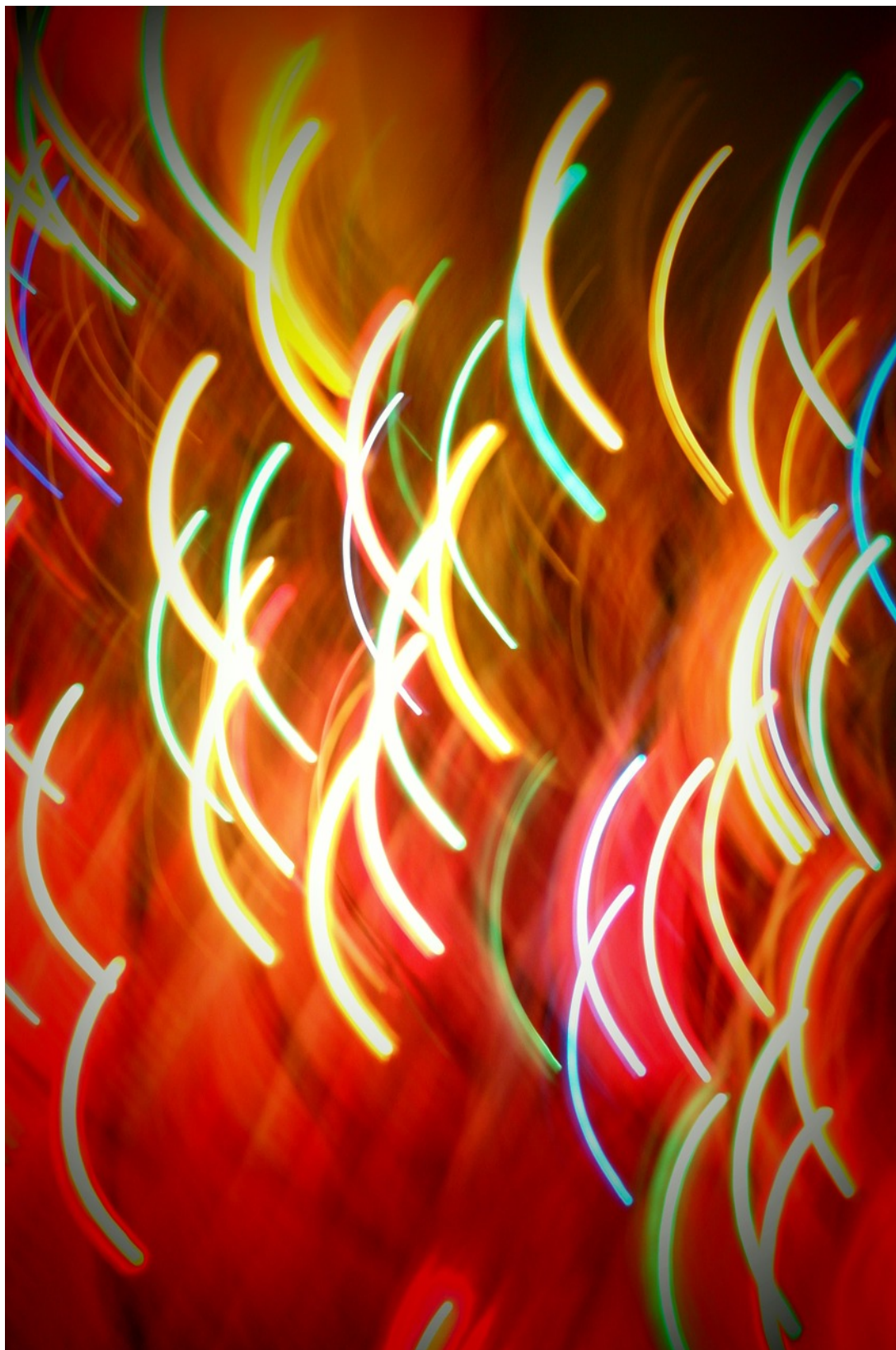
# Irregular as an Adjective

- *Falling below the manufacturer's standard.*
- *Not having clear dimensions that can be measured; volume must be determined with the principle of liquid displacement.*
- *Lacking continuity or regularity.*
- *Deviating from normal expectations; somewhat odd, strange, or abnormal.*
- *Not even or balanced in shape or arrangement.*
- *(of a verb or other word) having inflections that do not conform to the usual rules.*
- *Not occurring at expected times.*
- *Contrary to the rules or to that which is normal or established.*
- *Occurring at uneven or varying rates or intervals.*
- *Contrary to rule or accepted order or general practice.*
- *Not occurring at a regular rate or fixed intervals.*
- *(of troops) not belonging to regular or established army units.*
- *Failing to meet a standard of manufacture due to an imperfection.*
- *(of a surface or shape); not level or flat or symmetrical.*
- *(of a flower) having the petals differing in size and shape; zygomorphic.*
- *Independent in behavior or thought.*
- *(used of the military) not belonging to or engaged in by regular army forces.*
- *; not level or flat or symmetrical.*
- *Not belonging to or engaged in by regular army forces.*

<b>contrary to the rules</b>	Very opposed in nature or character or purpose.
<b><u>crooked</u></b>	Irregular in shape or outline. <i><b>Crooked</b> country roads.</i>
<b>episodic</b>	Of writing or narration; divided into or composed of episodes. <i><b>Episodic</b> in his affections.</i>
<b><u>erratic</u></b>	Having no fixed course. <i><b>Erratic</b> winds are the bane of a sailor.</i>
<b>ever-changing</b>	Marked by continuous change or effective action.
<b>fitful</b>	Intermittently stopping and starting. <i><b>Fitful</b> bursts of energy.</i>
<b>fluctuating</b>	Having unpredictable ups and downs. <i>A <b>fluctuating</b> level of demand.</i>
<b><u>haphazard</u></b>	Marked by great carelessness. <i>A most <b>haphazard</b> system of record keeping.</i>
<b>illegitimate</b>	Not authorized by the law; not in accordance with accepted standards or rules. <i>An <b>illegitimate</b> seizure of power.</i>

<b><u>improper</u></b>	Not in accordance with accepted standards, especially of morality or honesty. <b>Improper</b> banking practices.
<b>inconsistent</b>	Acting at variance with one's own principles or former behaviour. Parents can become <b>inconsistent</b> and lacking in control over their children.
<b>inconstant</b>	Frequently changing; variable or irregular. Swear not by the <b>inconstant</b> moon.
<b><u>incorrect</u></b>	(of a word or expression) not agreeing with grammatical principles. An <b>incorrect</b> transcription.
<b><u>intermittent</u></b>	Occurring at irregular intervals; not continuous or steady. <b>Intermittent</b> rain showers.
<b>lopsided</b>	Turned or twisted toward one side. A <b>lopsided</b> grin.
<b>maverick</b>	Unorthodox. <b>Maverick</b> politicians.
<b>misshapen</b>	So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly. <b>Misshapen</b> old fingers.
<b>occasional</b>	(of a literary composition, speech, religious service, etc.) produced on or intended for a special occasion. An <b>occasional</b> worker.
<b>off-and-on</b>	Intermittently stopping and starting.
<b>on-and-off</b>	No longer planned or scheduled.
<b>out of order</b>	Excluded from use or mention.
<b>patchy</b>	Irregular or uneven in quality, texture, etc. My knowledge of Egyptology is <b>patchy</b> .
<b>rough</b>	(of stationery) used for making preliminary notes. The lifeboat crew braved <b>rough</b> seas to rescue a couple.
<b><u>shaky</u></b>	Shaking or trembling. A cracked dangerously <b>shaky</b> table.
<b>spasmodic</b>	Occurring in spells and often abruptly. His body made a <b>spasmodic</b> jerk.
<b><u>sporadic</u></b>	Occurring at irregular intervals or only in a few places; scattered or isolated. <b>Sporadic</b> fighting broke out.
<b>temporary</b>	Not permanent; not lasting. <b>Temporary</b> housing.

<b><u>twisted</u></b>	(of a personality or a way of thinking) unpleasantly or unhealthily abnormal; warped. <i>Many of the facts seemed <b>twisted</b> out of any semblance to reality.</i>
<b><u>underground</u></b>	Relating to or denoting a group or movement seeking to explore alternative forms of lifestyle or artistic expression; radical and experimental. <i>An <b>underground</b> car park.</i>
<b>unethical</b>	Not morally correct. <i><b>Unethical</b> business practices.</i>
<b><u>uneven</u></b>	Not fairly matched as opponents. <i>An <b>uneven</b> gait.</i>
<b>unmethodical</b>	Not orderly and systematic. <i>His inability to locate the source of the trouble resulted in <b>unmethodical</b> chaos.</i>
<b>unorthodox</b>	Breaking with convention or tradition. <i>He frequently upset other scholars with his <b>unorthodox</b> views.</i>
<b><u>unpredictable</u></b>	Not able to be predicted; changeable. <i>An <b>unpredictable</b> or indeterminable future.</i>
<b><u>unprofessional</u></b>	Below or contrary to the standards expected in a particular profession. <i>Was censured for <b>unprofessional</b> conduct.</i>
<b>unpunctual</b>	Not happening or doing something at the agreed or proper time. <i>The trains into Tbilisi were notoriously <b>unpunctual</b>.</i>
<b><u>unscrupulous</u></b>	Having or showing no moral principles; not honest or fair. <i><b>Unscrupulous</b> politicians who would be happy to sell their country in order to gain power.</i>
<b>unsettled</b>	Not settled or established. <i>An <b>unsettled</b> issue.</i>
<b><u>unstable</u></b>	Subject to change; variable. <i>His rather <b>unstable</b> religious convictions.</i>
<b><u>unsteady</u></b>	Not firmly or solidly positioned. <i>Nathan pushed the mug into her <b>unsteady</b> hand.</i>
<b>unsystematic</b>	Not done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; unmethodical. <i><b>Unsystematic</b> and fragmentary records.</i>
<b>variable</b>	(of a quantity) able to assume different numerical values. <i>Awards can be for <b>variable</b> amounts.</i>

**Varying** degrees of success.

**wavering**

Moving in a quivering way; flickering.

A **wavering** flame.

<b>abnormal</b>	Deviating from what is normal or usual, typically in a way that is undesirable or worrying. <i><b>Abnormal</b> circumstances.</i>
<b>anomalous</b>	Deviating from what is standard, normal, or expected. <i>Advanced forms of life may be <b>anomalous</b> in the universe.</i>
<b>arrhythmic</b>	Relating to or suffering from cardiac arrhythmia. <i>The <b>arrhythmic</b> phrasing of the music.</i>
<b>astigmatism</b>	(optics) defect in an optical system in which light rays from a single point fail to converge in a single focal point.

<b>asymmetric</b>	Characterized by asymmetry in the spatial arrangement or placement of parts or components.
<b>asymmetrical</b>	Having parts that fail to correspond to one another in shape, size, or arrangement; lacking symmetry. <i><b>Asymmetrical</b> features.</i>
<b>asymmetry</b>	A lack of symmetry. <i>There was an <b>asymmetry</b> between the right and left ears.</i>
<b>atypical</b>	Not representative of a group, class, or type. <i>These days large families are <b>atypical</b>.</i>
<b>episodic</b>	Limited in duration to a single episode. <i>An <b>episodic</b> narrative.</i>
<b>erratic</b>	Having no fixed course. <i><b>Erratic</b> behavior.</i>
<b>fickle</b>	Changing frequently, especially as regards one's loyalties or affections. <i>Celebs trying to appeal to an increasingly <b>fickle</b> public.</i>
<b>imbalance</b>	(mathematics) a lack of symmetry. <i>A hormonal <b>imbalance</b>.</i>
<b>infrequent</b>	Not frequent; not occurring regularly or at short intervals. <i><b>Infrequent</b> outbursts of temper.</i>
<b>intermittent</b>	Stopping and starting at irregular intervals. <i><b>Intermittent</b> rain showers.</i>
<b>irregularity</b>	The state or quality of being irregular. <i>The <b>irregularity</b> of his breathing.</i>
<b>lopsided</b>	Turned or twisted toward one side- G.K.Chesterton. <i>A <b>lopsided</b> grin.</i>
<b>myopia</b>	Lack of foresight or intellectual insight. <i>The company's corporate <b>myopia</b>.</i>
<b>myopic</b>	Unable to see distant objects clearly. <i>Most <b>myopic</b> children can be fitted with glasses to correct their vision.</i>
<b>occasional</b>	Employed for a particular occasion or on an irregular basis. <i>An <b>occasional</b> worker.</i>
<b>patchy</b>	Existing or happening in small, isolated areas. <i>My knowledge of Egyptology is <b>patchy</b>.</i>
<b>quicksilver</b>	Liable to sudden unpredictable change. <i>A <b>quicksilver</b> character cool and willful at one moment utterly fragile the next.</i>

<b><u>sporadic</u></b>	Occurring at irregular intervals or only in a few places; scattered or isolated. <i><b>Sporadic</b> fighting broke out.</i>
<b>sporadically</b>	Occasionally or at irregular intervals. <i>The comedy is only <b>sporadically</b> funny.</i>
<b><u>spotty</u></b>	Of uneven quality; patchy. <i>His <b>spotty</b> record on the environment.</i>
<b>unbalance</b>	A state of mental disturbance and disorientation. <i>This sharing can often <b>unbalance</b> even the closest of relationships.</i>
<b>uncommon</b>	Marked by an uncommon quality especially superlative or extreme of its kind. <i>He was <b>uncommon</b> afraid.</i>
<b><u>uneven</u></b>	(of a contest) not equally balanced. <i>An <b>uneven</b> color.</i>
<b><u>unpredictable</u></b>	Not occurring at a regular rate or fixed intervals. <i>The <b>unpredictable</b> weather of the Scottish islands.</i>
<b><u>unsteady</u></b>	Liable to fall or shake; not steady in position. <i>Climbing carefully up the <b>unsteady</b> ladder.</i>
<b>unusual</b>	Remarkable or interesting because different from or better than others. <i>A man of <b>unusual</b> ability.</i>
