not pertinent Having precise or logical relevance to the matter at hand.

off the subject Below a satisfactory level.

peripheralRelated to the key issue but not of central importance.

Relating to or along a tangent.

A tangential line.

unconnected Lacking orderly continuity.

The earth wire was left **unconnected**.

Associations of "Irrelevant" (30 Words)

digressive Characterized by digression; tending to depart from the subject.

Not done directly; conducted through intermediaries.
