<b>unreplaceable</b>	Impossible to replace.
<b>worth its weight in gold</b>	Worthy of being treated in a particular way (often used ironically).

<b><u>durable</u></b>	Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay. <i>The <b>perdurable</b> granite of the ancient Appalachian spine of the continent.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>An <b>enduring</b> disposition.</i>
<b><u>fatal</u></b>	Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. <i>A <b>fatal</b> series of events.</i>
<b>finality</b>	An action or event that ends something irreversibly. <i>Death is the ultimate <b>finality</b>.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>How s the club <b>fixed</b> for money now.</i>
<b>immutable</b>	Constant and unchanging. <i>An <b>immutable</b> fact.</i>
<b>indelible</b>	Not able to be forgotten. <i>An <b>indelible</b> marker pen.</i>
<b>indestructible</b>	Very long lasting. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>ineradicable</b>	Unable to be destroyed or removed. <i><b>Ineradicable</b> superstitions.</i>
<b>inseparable</b>	A person or thing inseparable from another. <i>They met 18 months ago and have been <b>inseparable</b> ever since.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	Never changing. <i>An <b>invariable</b> temperature.</i>
<b>irremediable</b>	Impossible to remedy or correct or redress. <i><b>Irremediable</b> marital breakdowns.</i>
<b>irreparably</b>	In an irreparable manner or to an irreparable degree. <i>Our international image has been <b>irreparably</b> tarnished.</i>
<b><u>lasting</u></b>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long <b>lasting</b> friendship.</i>
<b>lastingly</b>	In an enduring or permanent manner.

<b><u>memorable</u></b>	Worth remembering. <i>He recalled <b>memorable</b> moments in his life.</i>
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	Not capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition. <i>A <b>permanent</b> ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
<b><u>stable</u></b>	Shelter in a stable. <i>He is now in a <b>stable</b> condition in hospital.</i>
<b>standing</b>	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>A member in good <b>standing</b>.</i>
<b>unalienable</b>	Incapable of being repudiated or transferred to another. <i>Endowed by their Creator with certain <b>unalienable</b> rights.</i>
<b><u>unchangeable</u></b>	Not liable to variation or able to be altered. <i>A fixed and <b>unchangeable</b> part of the germ plasm.</i>
<b><u>unchanging</u></b>	Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
