<u>consistent</u>	In agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>Bituminous coal is often treated as a consistent and homogeneous product.</i>

constant	(of a person) unchangingly faithful and dependable. <i>The condition of struggle remained a constant.</i>
<u>durable</u>	Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay. <i>The perdurable granite of the ancient Appalachian spine of the continent.</i>
<u>enduring</u>	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>An enduring disposition.</i>
<u>fatal</u>	Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. <i>A fatal series of events.</i>
finality	An action or event that ends something irreversibly. <i>Death is the ultimate finality.</i>
fixed	Having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>How s the club fixed for money now.</i>
immutable	Constant and unchanging. <i>An immutable fact.</i>
indelible	Not able to be forgotten. <i>An indelible marker pen.</i>
indestructible	Very long lasting. <i>Indestructible plastic containers.</i>
ineradicable	Unable to be destroyed or removed. <i>Ineradicable superstitions.</i>
inseparable	A person or thing inseparable from another. <i>They met 18 months ago and have been inseparable ever since.</i>
invariable	Never changing. <i>An invariable temperature.</i>
irremediable	Impossible to remedy or correct or redress. <i>Irremediable marital breakdowns.</i>
irreparably	In an irreparable manner or to an irreparable degree. <i>Our international image has been irreparably tarnished.</i>
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long lasting friendship.</i>
lastingly	In an enduring or permanent manner.

<u>memorable</u>	Worth remembering. <i>He recalled memorable moments in his life.</i>
<u>permanent</u>	Not capable of being reversed or returned to the original condition. <i>A permanent ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
<u>stable</u>	Shelter in a stable. <i>He is now in a stable condition in hospital.</i>
standing	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>A member in good standing.</i>
unalienable	Incapable of being repudiated or transferred to another. <i>Endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights.</i>
<u>unchangeable</u>	Not liable to variation or able to be altered. <i>A fixed and unchangeable part of the germ plasm.</i>
<u>unchanging</u>	Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i>
