alluring

Powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating; seductive.
*An **alluring** prospect.*

<u>compelling</u>	Not able to be refuted; inspiring conviction. <i>His eyes were strangely compelling.</i>
<u>compulsive</u>	Irresistibly interesting or exciting; compelling. <i>A compulsive liar.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>Difficult to say no to an enticing advertisement.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Attractive and tempting. <i>The sea down there looks so inviting.</i>
irrepressible	Not able to be controlled or restrained. <i>A great shout of irrepressible laughter.</i>
overpowering	Extremely strong or intense; overwhelming. <i>A feeling of overpowering sadness.</i>
<u>overwhelming</u>	So strong as to be irresistible. <i>His party won overwhelming support.</i>
resistless	Offering no resistance. <i>Irresistible or resistless impulses.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
<u>tempting</u>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>A tempting repast.</i>
<u>uncontrollable</u>	Incapable of being controlled or managed. <i>Her brother had an uncontrollable temper.</i>
ungovernable	Incapable of being controlled. <i>An ungovernable impulse to run away.</i>

entertaining	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>Films should be entertaining.</i>
enthralling	Capturing and holding one's attention; fascinating. <i>An enthralling best seller.</i>
entrancing	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>An entrancing smile.</i>
exciting	Creating or arousing excitement. <i>An exciting novel.</i>
fascinating	Extremely interesting. <i>A fascinating book.</i>
funny	Causing laughter or amusement; humorous. <i>There was something funny going on.</i>
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense anxiety.</i>

interesting	Arousing or holding the attention. <i>It will be very interesting to see what they come up with.</i>
intriguing	Arousing one's curiosity or interest; fascinating. <i>The food is an intriguing combination of German and French.</i>
irresistibly	In a way that is too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>Their eyes were drawn irresistibly back to the house.</i>
<u>overwhelming</u>	Very strong; urgently felt. <i>Overwhelming joy.</i>
<u>riveting</u>	Completely engrossing; compelling. <i>The book is a riveting account of the legendary freedom fighter.</i>
<u>salient</u>	(of an animal) standing on its hind legs with the forepaws raised, as if leaping. <i>Salient traits.</i>
stardom	The state or status of being a very famous or talented entertainer or sports player. <i>Her rise to stardom has been meteoric.</i>
<u>super</u>	Superfine fabric or manufacture. <i>A super experiment.</i>
<u>thrilling</u>	Causing quivering or shivering as by cold or fear or electric shock. <i>A thrilling performer to watch.</i>
unbearably	In a way that is impossible or extremely hard to endure. <i>The men and their families have suffered unbearably.</i>
vast	An immense space. <i>The vast accumulation of knowledge which we call civilization.</i>
