- Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality.
- Showing a lack of respect for people or things that are generally taken seriously.
- Not revering god.

Synonyms of "Irreverent" as an adjective (10 Words)

<u>contemptuous</u>	Showing contempt; scornful. She was intolerant and contemptuous of the majority of the human race.
derisive	Abusing vocally; expressing contempt or ridicule. <i>He gave a harsh derisive laugh.</i>
disdainful	Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one views as unworthy. Some economists are disdainful of their colleagues in other social disciplines.



disparaging	Expressive of low opinion. Disparaging remarks about council houses.
disrespectful	Exhibiting lack of respect; rude and discourteous. A deeply disrespectful attitude towards women.
godless	Profane; wicked. A mob reeling out from their godless pleasures.
<u>impertinent</u>	Not pertinent to a particular matter; irrelevant. <i>Talk of rhetoric and strategy is</i> impertinent to this process.
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. A pert slightly plump girl called Rose.
<u>saucy</u>	Having or expressing a bold, lively, or spirited manner. <i>Saucy postcards.</i>
<u>scornful</u>	Expressing extreme contempt. The opposition were scornful of the Prime Minister s proposal.

Usage Examples of "Irreverent" as an adjective

- Noisy irreverent tourists.
- A certain irreverent gaiety and ease of manner.
- Irreverent scholars mocking sacred things.
- She is irreverent about the whole business of politics.

Associations of "Irreverent" (30 Words)

barefaced	Shameless and undisguised. His years of working barefaced breathing down dust.
<u>blasphemous</u>	Sacrilegious against God or sacred things; profane. <i>Blasphemous</i> and heretical talk.
<u>brazen</u>	Face with defiance or impudence. There was nothing to do but brazen it out.
<u>chutzpah</u>	Unbelievable gall; insolence; audacity. Love him or hate him you have to admire Cohen s chutzpah .
confident	A confidant. His manner is more confident these days.
effrontery	Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to. One juror had the effrontery to challenge the coroner s decision.



flippant	Showing inappropriate levity. A flippant remark.
frivolity	Lack of seriousness; light-heartedness. A night of fun and frivolity .
<u>gall</u>	The contents of the gall bladder bile proverbial for its bitterness. It gall s me that we lost the suit.
impertinence	Lack of respect; rudeness. They gasped at the impertinence of the suggestion.
<u>impertinent</u>	Improperly forward or bold. <i>Impertinent</i> of a child to lecture a grownup.
impious	Lacking piety or reverence for a god. <i>The emperor s impious attacks on the Church.</i>
impolite	Not having or showing good manners; rude. It would have been impolite to refuse.
impudence	The quality of being impudent; impertinence. <i>His arrogance and impudence had offended many.</i>
impudent	Marked by casual disrespect. The student was kept in for impudent behavior.
insolence	An offensive disrespectful impudent act. <i>She was sacked for insolence</i> .
<u>insolent</u>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. The modern world with its quick material successes and insolent belief in the boundless possibilities of progress.
lewd	Crude and offensive in a sexual way. She began to gyrate to the music and sing a lewd song.
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. She had a pert nose and deep blue eyes.
<u>presumptuous</u>	Excessively forward. The duchess would not put up with presumptuous servants.
<u>profane</u>	Not relating to that which is sacred or religious; secular. A profane person might be tempted to violate the tomb.
ribald	A ribald person someone who uses vulgar and offensive language. <i>Ribald</i> language.
rude	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. It s rude to talk about people right in front of them.



sacrilegious	Involving or committing sacrilege. It seems sacrilegious to say this but it s really not that great a film.
shameless	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. A shameless imposter.
temerity	Fearless daring. No one had the temerity to question his conclusions.
<u>unashamed</u>	Expressed or acting openly and without guilt or embarrassment. An unashamed emotionalism.
ungodly	Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin. Ungodly lives of lust and pleasure.
unrepentant	Showing no regret for one's wrongdoings. <i>He was unrepentant and said that his comments were completely accurate.</i>
