### Synonyms of "Irreverent" as an adjective (10 Words)

**Contemptuous** Showing contempt; scornful.

She was intolerant and contemptuous of the majority of the human race.

derisive Abusing vocally; expressing contempt or ridicule.

He gave a harsh **derisive** laugh.

Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one views

as unworthy.

disdainful
Some economists are disdainful of their colleagues in other social

disciplines.



**disparaging** Expressive of low opinion.

**Disparaging** remarks about council houses.

**disrespectful** Exhibiting lack of respect; rude and discourteous.

A deeply **disrespectful** attitude towards women.

**godless** Profane; wicked.

A mob reeling out from their **godless** pleasures.

impertinent Not pertinent to a particular matter; irrelevant.

Talk of rhetoric and strategy is **impertinent** to this process.

**pert** Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality.

A **pert** slightly plump girl called Rose.

Having or expressing a bold, lively, or spirited manner.

**Saucy** postcards.

**scornful** Expressing extreme contempt.

The opposition were **scornful** of the Prime Minister s proposal.

Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to.

One juror had the **effrontery** to challenge the coroner s decision.



**flippant** Showing inappropriate levity.

A **flippant** remark.

frivolity Lack of seriousness; light-heartedness.

A night of fun and **frivolity**.

The contents of the gall bladder bile proverbial for its bitterness.

It **gall**s me that we lost the suit.

**impertinence** Lack of respect; rudeness.

They gasped at the **impertinence** of the suggestion.

impertinent Improperly forward or bold.

**Impertinent** of a child to lecture a grownup.

impious Lacking piety or reverence for a god.

The emperor s **impious** attacks on the Church.

impolite Not having or showing good manners; rude.

It would have been **impolite** to refuse.

impudence The quality of being impudent; impertinence.

His arrogance and **impudence** had offended many.

impudent Marked by casual disrespect.

The student was kept in for **impudent** behavior.

insolence An offensive disrespectful impudent act.

She was sacked for **insolence**.

Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times.

**insolent** The modern world with its quick material successes and **insolent** belief in

the boundless possibilities of progress.

**lewd** Crude and offensive in a sexual way.

She began to gyrate to the music and sing a **lewd** song.

**pert** Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality.

She had a **pert** nose and deep blue eyes.

Excessively forward.

<u>presumptuous</u>
The duchess would not put up with **presumptuous** servants.

Not relating to that which is sacred or religious; secular.

A **profane** person might be tempted to violate the tomb.

A ribald person someone who uses vulgar and offensive language.

ribald Person someone who uses varigar and oriensive language.

Ribald language.

Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by

**rude** simplicity and often crudeness.

sacrilegious Involving or committing sacrilege.

It seems **sacrilegious** to say this but it s really not that great a film.

(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame;

**shameless** barefaced or brazen.

A **shameless** imposter.

temerity Fearless daring.

No one had the **temerity** to question his conclusions.

**unashamed** Expressed or acting openly and without guilt or embarrassment.

An **unashamed** emotionalism.

ungodly

Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin.

**Ungodly** lives of lust and pleasure.

Showing no regret for one's wrongdoings.

**unrepentant** He was **unrepentant** and said that his comments were completely

accurate.
