
## Irreversible as an Adjective

# Synonyms of "Irreversible" as an adjective (5 Words)

**irremediable** Impossible to cure or put right. *Irremediable* marital breakdowns.

(of an injury or loss) impossible to rectify or repair. irreparable

They were doing **irreparable** damage to my heart and lungs.

Incapable of being retracted or revoked. irrevocable

An irrevocable step.

**unrectifiable** Not rectifiable; impossible to improve upon or correct.

Impossible to repair. unrepairable

A large consignment of defective and unrepairable goods.

**certainly** Definitely or positively (`sure' is sometimes used informally for `surely.

She **certainly** is a hard worker.

A fact that is definitely true or an event that is definitely going to take

**certainty** place.

She knew with absolute **certainty** that they were dead.

conclusive (of a victory) achieved easily or by a large margin.

The findings were by no means **conclusive**.

**confirming** Serving to support or corroborate.

**constant** A quantity that does not vary.

A man **constant** in adherence to his ideals.

**decided** (of a person) having clear opinions; resolute.

You could never talk him round he was very **decided**.

**definite** Clearly true or real; unambiguous.

I want a **definite** answer.

**demonstrable** Capable of being demonstrated or proved.

**Demonstrable** truths.

**determinate** Having exact and discernible limits or form.

A **determinate** answer to the problem.

determined Having been learned or found or determined especially by investigation.

Alina was **determined** to be heard.

explicit Of a person stating something in an explicit manner.

The arrangement had not been made **explicit**.

of a number having a fixed and unchanging value.

Living on **fixed** incomes.

A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears.

grinding

Crush it and add it to the honey with a grinding of pepper and salt.

incessantly Without interruption.

She talked about him **incessantly**.



indubitable Impossible to doubt; unquestionable.

An **indubitable** truth.

irremediable Impossible to cure or put right.

Irremediable marital breakdowns.

irreparable (of an injury or loss) impossible to rectify or repair.

They were doing **irreparable** damage to my heart and lungs.

**irrevocable** Incapable of being retracted or revoked.

An **irrevocable** step.

iustified Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins.

A neatly **justified** list of names.

**obvious** Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind.

*Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.* 

**palpability** The quality of being perceivable by touch.

Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely.

Some temporary workers did not want a **permanent** job.

**perspicuity** Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.

perspicuous (of language) transparently clear; easily understandable.

A **perspicuous** argument.

resolute Characterized by quickness and firmness.

Faced with a **resolute** opposition.

Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely.

Was **sure** or certain she had seen it.

undoubtedly Without doubt; certainly.

They are **undoubtedly** quilty.

Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or

<u>unequivocal</u> interpretation and leading to only one conclusion.

An **unequivocal** answer.

unmistakable Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment.

His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.
