<b>constant</b>	A quantity that does not vary. <i>A man <b>constant</b> in adherence to his ideals.</i>
<b>decided</b>	(of a person) having clear opinions; resolute. <i>You could never talk him round he was very <b>decided</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>definite</u></a>	Clearly true or real; unambiguous. <i>I want a <b>definite</b> answer.</i>
<b>demonstrable</b>	Capable of being demonstrated or proved. <i><b>Demonstrable</b> truths.</i>
<b>determinate</b>	Having exact and discernible limits or form. <i>A <b>determinate</b> answer to the problem.</i>
<b>determined</b>	Having been learned or found or determined especially by investigation. <i>Alina was <b>determined</b> to be heard.</i>
<a href="#"><u>explicit</u></a>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>The arrangement had not been made <b>explicit</b>.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Of a number having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>Living on <b>fixed</b> incomes.</i>
<a href="#"><u>grinding</u></a>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>Crush it and add it to the honey with a <b>grinding</b> of pepper and salt.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>

<b>indubitable</b>	Impossible to doubt; unquestionable. <i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>
<b>irremediable</b>	Impossible to cure or put right. <i><b>Irremediable</b> marital breakdowns.</i>
<b>irreparable</b>	(of an injury or loss) impossible to rectify or repair. <i>They were doing <b>irreparable</b> damage to my heart and lungs.</i>
<b>irrevocable</b>	Incapable of being retracted or revoked. <i>An <b>irrevocable</b> step.</i>
<b>justified</b>	Having words so spaced that lines have straight even margins. <i>A neatly <b>justified</b> list of names.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Unemployment has been the most <b>obvious</b> cost of the recession.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>Some temporary workers did not want a <b>permanent</b> job.</i>
<b>perspicuity</b>	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
<b>perspicuous</b>	(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable. <i>A <b>perspicuous</b> argument.</i>
<b><u>resolute</u></b>	Characterized by quickness and firmness. <i>Faced with a <b>resolute</b> opposition.</i>
<b><u>sure</u></b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>Was <b>sure</b> or certain she had seen it.</i>
<b><u>undoubtedly</u></b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.</i>
<b><u>unequivocal</u></b>	Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion. <i>An <b>unequivocal</b> answer.</i>
<b><u>unmistakable</u></b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>His opposition to slavery was <b>unmistakable</b>.</i>
