| changeless | Remaining the same. <i>Changeless truths.</i> |
| committed | Bound or obligated, as under a pledge to a particular cause, action, or attitude. <i>A committed Marxist.</i> |
| confirmed | Having been established or made firm or received the rite of confirmation. <i>Received confirmed reports of casualties.</i> |
| constant | A situation that does not change. <i>Constant as the northern star.</i> |
| <u>continually</u> | Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly. <i>This information is continually updated.</i> |
| continuously | Without interruption or gaps. <i>These images loop continuously.</i> |
| endless | (of a belt, chain, or tape) having the ends joined to form a loop allowing continuous action. <i>Endless waves.</i> |
| <u>enduring</u> | Lasting over a period of time; durable. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i> |
| <u>eternal</u> | Lasting or existing forever; without end. <i>Eternal nagging demands.</i> |

| eternity | A state to which time has no application; timelessness. <i>Immortal souls destined for eternity.</i> |
| ever | At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Why ever did you do it.</i> |
| every | (used of count nouns) each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i>Every chance of winning.</i> |
| forever | For a limitless time- P.P.Bliss. <i>It took forever to get a passport.</i> |
| immutable | Unchanging over time or unable to be changed. <i>An immutable fact.</i> |
| incessant | Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i> |
| incessantly | With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i> |
| invariably | In every case or on every occasion; always. <i>Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.</i> |
| permanence | The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and permanence of the dyes.</i> |
| permanency | The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration. |
| perpetual | Never ending or changing. <i>A perpetual secretary of the society.</i> |
| perpetually | In a way that never ends or changes; constantly. <i>Perpetually hungry teenage boys.</i> |
| persistent | Never-ceasing. <i>An attempt to stop persistent drink drivers.</i> |
| steady | Make or become steady. <i>She tried to keep her voice steady.</i> |
| unceasing | Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>Man s unceasing warfare with drought and isolation.</i> |
| unchangeable | Not changeable or subject to change. <i>The unchangeable seasons.</i> |
| unlimited | That cannot be entirely consumed or used up. <i>To start with a theory of unlimited freedom is to end up with unlimited despotism.</i> |
| utter | Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words. <i>Utter seriousness.</i> |
