## Associations of "Irrigation" (30 Words)

<b>aqueduct</b>	A conduit that resembles a bridge but carries water over a valley.
<b>basin</b>	The quantity that a basin will hold. <i>The Amazon <b>basin</b>.</i>
<b>canal</b>	Provide a city with a canal. <i>They travelled on by <b>canal</b>.</i>
<b>canalize</b>	Convert (a river) into a navigable canal. <i>Successive railway engineers were to divert and <b>canalize</b> many miles of river.</i>
<b>channel</b>	A service or station using a channel of frequencies. <i>She was <b>channelling</b> the spirit of Billie Holiday.</i>
<b>coast</b>	A slope down which sleds may coast. <i>The west <b>coast</b> of Africa.</i>
<b>conduit</b>	A passage (a pipe or tunnel) through which water or electric wires can pass. <i>The gas pipe should not be close to any electrical <b>conduit</b>.</i>
<b>ditch</b>	Provide with a ditch or ditches. <i><b>Ditch</b> the land to drain it.</i>
<b>drain</b>	Empty of liquid drain the liquid from. <i>The land was <b>drained</b> and the boggy ground reclaimed.</i>
<b>drainage</b>	A system of drains. <i>They set about renewing and repairing <b>drainage</b> and water supplies.</i>
<b>exhaust</b>	The system through which exhaust gases are expelled. <i>This kind of work <b>exhausts</b> me.</i>
<b>flow</b>	The amount of fluid that flows in a given time. <i>Under the ford the river backs up giving a deep sluggish <b>flow</b>.</i>
<b>fluvial</b>	Of or found in a river. <i><b>Fluvial</b> deposits.</i>

<b>incised</b>	Cut or impressed into a surface. <i>An <b>incised</b> design.</i>
<b>irrigate</b>	Supply water to (land or crops) to help growth, typically by means of channels. <i><b>Irrigate</b> the wound.</i>
<b>isthmus</b>	A narrow strip of land with sea on either side, forming a link between two larger areas of land.
<b>lake</b>	A body of (usually fresh) water surrounded by land. <i>The EU wine <b>lake</b>.</i>
<b>metamorphic</b>	Of or marked by metamorphosis. <i>Marble is a <b>metamorphic</b> rock that takes a high polish.</i>
<b>moat</b>	Surround a place with a moat.
<b>navigable</b>	(of a waterway or sea) able to be sailed on by ships or boats. <i><b>Navigable</b> waters.</i>
<b>pipe</b>	Play a tune on a pipe or pipes. <i><b>Pipe</b> a tune.</i>
<b>pipeline</b>	Convey a substance by a pipeline. <i>Chip designers <b>pipeline</b> the instructions given to the hardware.</i>
<b>river</b>	A large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea a lake or another river. <i>The <b>river</b> was navigable for 50 miles.</i>
<b>sedimentary</b>	(of rock) that has formed from sediment deposited by water or air.
<b>strait</b>	A bad or difficult situation or state of affairs. <i>My captivity was <b>strait</b> as ever.</i>
<b>surfing</b>	The sport or pastime of riding a wave towards the shore while standing or lying on a surfboard. <i>Why share your internet connection with people <b>surfing</b> and chatting.</i>
<b>trench</b>	A trench coat. <i>The slaughter in the <b>trenches</b> created a new cynicism.</i>
<b>vacate</b>	Leave (a job, post, or position) voluntarily. <i>You must <b>vacate</b> your office by tonight.</i>
<b>waterway</b>	A channel at the outer edge of a deck of a boat that allows water to run off. <i>The canal was a very successful commercial <b>waterway</b>.</i>
