chthonic	Relating to or inhabiting the underworld. <i>A chthonic deity.</i>
correction	A change that rectifies an error or inaccuracy. <i>The correction of his vision with eye glasses.</i>
<u>demon</u>	Someone extremely diligent or skillful. <i>She s a demon at math.</i>
<u>demonic</u>	Fiercely energetic or frenzied. <i>A demonic hurry.</i>
derivation	Drawing off water from its main channel as for irrigation. <i>Singer from sing or undo from do are examples of derivations.</i>
<u>derivative</u>	Resulting from or employing derivation. <i>Equity based derivative products.</i>
devil	Chief spirit of evil and adversary of God; tempter of mankind; master of Hell. <i>You lucky devil.</i>
devilry	Reckless or malicious behavior that causes discomfort or annoyance in others. <i>Some devilry was afoot.</i>
diabolic	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i>Fires lit up a diabolic scene.</i>
<u>diabolical</u>	Disgracefully bad or unpleasant. <i>A singer with an absolutely diabolical voice.</i>
exorcise	Completely remove (something unpleasant) from one’s mind or memory. <i>Infants were exorcised prior to baptism.</i>
fiend	An evil spirit or demon. <i>Britain s most notorious sex fiend.</i>

fiendish	Extremely cruel or unpleasant. <i>Fiendish methods of torture.</i>
ghost	Act as ghostwriter of a work. <i>I didn't want to ghost her so we ended up having the talk and it was horrible.</i>
horrible	Causing or likely to cause horror; shocking. <i>War is beyond all words horrible.</i>
hydra	(Greek mythology) monster with nine heads; when struck off each head was replaced by two new ones. <i>We may be facing a hydra that defies any easy solution.</i>
infernal	Being of the underworld. <i>The infernal regions.</i>
language	Coarse or offensive language. <i>The language of sociology.</i>
lexicon	A reference book containing an alphabetical list of words with information about them. <i>The size of the English lexicon.</i>
malevolent	Having or showing a wish to do evil to others. <i>Malevolent stars.</i>
maliciousness	Feeling a need to see others suffer.
perdition	(Christianity) the abode of Satan and the forces of evil; where sinners suffer eternal punishment. <i>She used her last banknote to buy herself a square meal before perdition.</i>
purgatory	Mental anguish or suffering. <i>Infernal punishments are purgatory and medicinal.</i>
sentence	Pronounce a sentence on somebody in a court of law. <i>Her husband is serving a three year sentence for fraud.</i>
spelling	A person's ability to spell words. <i>Her spelling was deplorable.</i>
translate	Be translatable, or be translatable in a certain way. <i>I have to translate when my in laws from Austria visit the U S.</i>
typo	A typographical error.
underworld	The criminal class. <i>A prominent underworld figure.</i>
vocabulary	A language user's knowledge of words. <i>The vocabulary of law.</i>
